RUDSTON VILLAGE BINGO

We're glad to announce that Village Bingo has recommenced after being shutdown due to Coronavirus. To try and increase the number of households that are supporting this fundraiser, we have recently delivered flyers to most of the houses within the village to encourage new members. Currently all profits are being split between the playing field and newsletter (two thirds to the playing field and one third to the newsletter), however before we are able to give away any of the profits we have to make around £700 per year to cover the costs of the lottery licence, printing, bingo tickets and prizes.

The bingo relies on the support of people living in Rudston and without this we would not be able to help the various groups within the village. It only costs 10p per book per week to play with the number of books varying between 1 to 10 – it's your choice. There are two prizes for each game - £50 for the snowball numbers and £40 for a full house. Both prizes are shared amongst however many winners there are, ie if four people each have a full house then they will win £10 each.

Playing Village Bingo is easy - each week's numbers will be delivered to your home and new bingo books will be issued as and when. All you need to do is tick off the numbers on the slip to your book(s) to see if you are a winner. Subs need to be paid in advance and will be collected from your home. Should you turn out to have a winning ticket then please get any claim to me, Paula Beresford, Wold Garth, Eastgate by 8pm on a Sunday.

So, if you'd like to help raise funds for Rudston please give me a call on 420708 or knock on my door. We need your support to keep this going and to help keep the village thriving.

DO YOU LIVE OUTSIDE THE VILLAGE BUT WOULD STILL LIKE TO PLAY?

I am aware that there are a lot of outlying properties within the parish and this has probably put you at a disadvantage where the village bingo is concerned. One thing that a lot of people will have had to learn during the last 16-17 months is paying people using online banking, myself included. I already run a staff lottery syndicate at work and this has worked really well during the last year or so. I wondered therefore whether we could use the same process with the village bingo so that everyone could be included.

My intentions would be to send out the bingo tickets each week via email or to anyone with a smart phone that can accept pdf documents. Payment could be made by online banking to myself. This would just leave the matter of getting the bingo books to any players.

Notice of Casual Vacancy

Due to the resignation of Cllr Tompkin, a vacancy has occurred among the members of the Parish Council. Any person willing to fill this vacancy should apply to the Clerk in writing. The applicants name must appear on the current local electoral register, or the applicant should have, during the whole of the twelve months preceding the relevant date, resided in or within three miles of the parish, or the applicant's only place of work during the whole of the twelve months preceding the relevant date is in the parish. The applicant must not be debarred from standing as a Councillor. Public elections cannot be held until 2023 but for the interim period election to the aforesaid Council will be voted for by the present sitting number of Councillors.

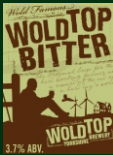
