Unfortunately there isn't enough room on the field for the previously suggested idea of a rugby post. Any other ideas/ suggestions are welcome.

The security and insurance of the pavilion and garage were discussed following the break in and theft of lawnmowers earlier this season and it was decided to install cameras and security lighting.
