### **Stuffing for turkey**

4oz bacon, fried and chopped 6 tablespoons suet 8oz fresh white breadcrumbs 2 tablespoons chopped parsley grated rind of 1 or 2 lemons salt and pepper

thaw, add 2 eggs, beaten, stuff neck end of turkey

(this is enough for a turkey, use half for a chicken)

While you are making breadcrumbs make and freeze 3 oz for the bread sauce

Thaw the crumbs and add ¾ pint milk, which has been infused with onion, cloves, peppercorn, and bayleaf


