Rudston's Recipes

MALTESER CHEESECAKE

Ingredients



200g/7oz chocolate Hobnobs ½oz unsalted butter 400g/14oz full-fat cream cheese, at room temperature 250g/9oz mascarpone, at room temperature 75g/3oz icing sugar, sifted 1 tsp vanilla extract 100g/3½oz Maltesers

Method

- Put biscuits in a freezer bag and crush them with a rolling pin.
- Place crushed biscuits in a microwaveable bowl along with the butter. Heat up in the microwave on full until chocolate and butter have melted a bit and the mixture becomes soft. I usually find it takes 2-2½ minutes but heat up in stages, so that the mixture doesn't get overheated. Alternatively melt 1-1½oz of butter in a saucepan and mix in the crushed biscuits. Press the mixture into the bottom of a 23cm/9in springform or loose-bottomed tin. Chill in the fridge while you make the topping.
- Combine the cream cheese and mascarpone in a large mixing bowl, either by hand or with an electric handheld mixer until light and fluffy. Add the icing sugar a little at a time and blend to incorporate. Finally, mix in the vanilla.
- Place the Maltesers in a freezer bag and crush lightly with a rolling pin, just to break them apart.Fold half into the cream cheese mixture until thoroughly combined.
- Spread the cream cheese mixture over the biscuit base and smooth the top. Cover with cling film and chill in the fridge for at least 4 hours (the longer, the better).
- When ready to serve, sprinkle the remaining Maltesers over the top of the cheesecake, then slice, serve and enjoy.

Baileys Mocha Fudge Dessert

Serves 8



1 chocolate loaf cake
 11oz dark chocolate
 2 oz butter
 9oz Mascarpone (or cream cheese)
 4oz caster sugar
 2 tbsps instant coffee granules
 7 fl oz double cream
 3 tbsps Baileys liqueurs
 grated chocolate or cocoa or whatever to decorate

Slice the cake thickly and use to line the base of an 8" loose bottomed cake tin, which has been lined with non stick parchment

Melt chocolate and butter in a bowl over a pan of hot water, stir and set aside

Whisk the mascarpone, sugar, coffee, cream and Baileys until thick. Fold in the chocolate mixture until well blended. Spoon into the tin smooth, cover and chill for at least 4 – 5 hours

Decorate

As an alternative to an 8" round tin this amount will make 2 desserts in loaf tins - put the sponge cake on top of the mixtures so that it is on the base when turned out.

It is nice with some raspberries served on the side


