#### ALL THE ELEMENTS OF A GOVERNMENT



A major research institution has announced the discovery of the heaviest element yet known to science, it has been named 'governmentium'. This new element has 1 neutron, 12 assistant neutrons, 75 deputy neutrons and 11 assistant deputy neutrons giving it a huge atomic mass. These particles are held together by forces called morons, which are surrounded by vast quantities of lepton-like particles known as peons.

Since governmentium has no electrons, it is inert. However, it can be detected, because it impedes every action with which it comes into contact. A minute amount of governmentium causes a reaction to take four days to complete, when it would normally take less than a second. Governmentium has a normal half-life of five years.

It does not decay, but instead undergoes a reorganisation in which a portion of the assistant neutrons change places. In fact, governmentium's mass will actually increase over time, since each reorganisation will cause more morons to become neutrons, forming isodopes.

This hypothetical quantity is referred to as 'critical morass' When catalysed with money governmentium becomes administratium, an element which radiates just as much energy as governmentium, since it has half as many Peons, but twice as many morons.



# **Rudston's Recipes**

#### All in one sponge

#### Ingredients

2 x 8" (20 cm) cake tins lined with grease proof paper
Tub of margarine or butter (do not use the blocks)
6 oz Self Raising Flour
6 oz margarine
6 oz sugar
3 eggs
2 teaspoons of baking powder

#### Method

Turn oven to max temp
Sieve flour and baking powder
Put all ingredients into a bowl and whisk or fork until soft and fluffy
Divide equally between the two tins and level off
Use middle shelf of oven with tins side by side
When tins are in the oven, turn temp to Gas 4/180 degrees
After 20 minutes, check cake which should be springy to touch.

If not ready, give another 5 minutes – watch carefully to check they do not burn
Put tins onto cooling rack and allow to cool approx. 10 -15 minutes
When cold carefully remove from tins

#### **Buttercream Recipe**

6-8oz icing sugar and 3 oz margarine

Put margarine into a bowl and beat with fork or mixer until light & fluffy, add icing sugar gradually to margarine, stirring all the time with a fork (if mixture is not soft enough to spread on cake, add 1 tablespoon of warm milk a bit at a time until mixture is soft enough to spread.

Spread strawberry jam on one half of the cake and then spread the buttercream on






