Despite being met by hail, rain, wind and some snow for good measure, more than 40 members of our community came together on 5th March to plant over 100 trees and shrubs in the garden of the Bosville Arms.

The trees and shrubs were bought using a grant received from the East Riding Community Tree Fund, part of the Northern Forest project. The project aims to plant 50,000 trees from Liverpool to the East Riding of Yorkshire over a 25-year period.

The grant was sourced and optimised by the Rudston Community Pub Ltd committee.



Pork and Peaches -

this recipe is so simple but tastes amazing!!

Ingredients



4 Pork Chops 14 oz tin of peach halves 1 oz butter 1 Tbsp Brown Sugar Sauce 2tbsp white wine vinegar ½ chicken stock cube 5 fl oz double cream Salt and Pepper

Method (yes, it's really this simple!!)

Fry chops for approx. 3 minutes each side to brown Drain peaches and place a half on each chop Dot peaches with butter and sprinkle the sugar on the peaches Bake for 30 mins on gas mark 5, 190 degrees C / 375 degrees F Sauce (about 10 minutes before serving) Place vinegar, juice and stock cube in a pan Whisk together and bring to the boil, simmer for 3 minutes Add cream, stir on low heat for 3 minutes Season


