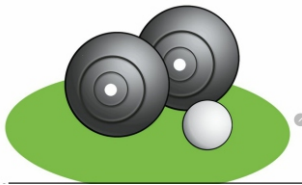

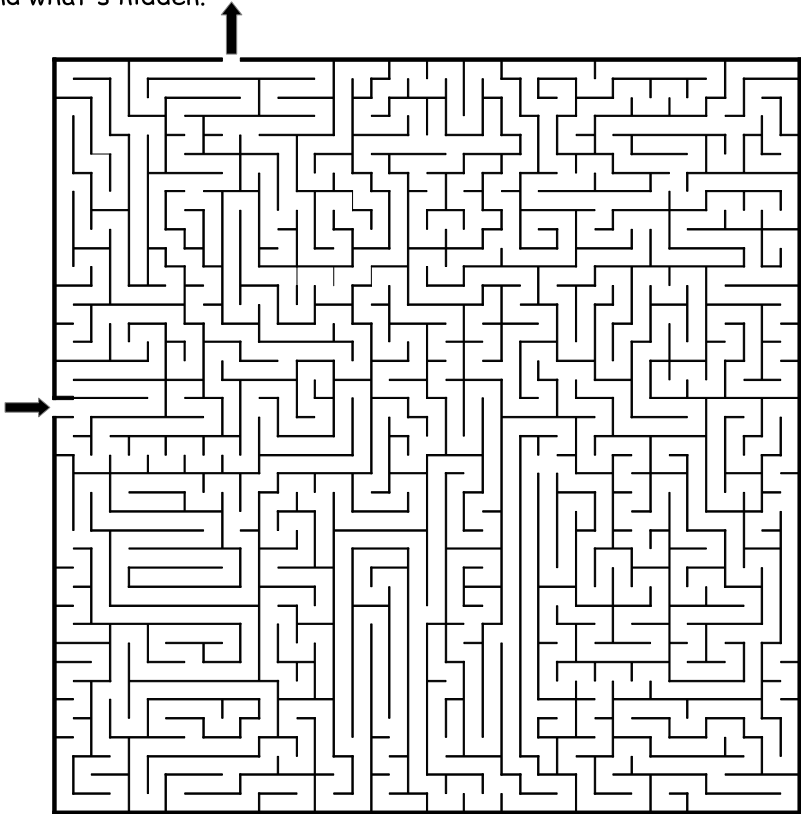

Rudston's Recipes

DEVILLED MUSHROOM CUPS

Ingredients

- 4 large thin slices of white bread
- 75g/3oz melted butter
- 50g/2oz pickling onions
- 1 thick gammon steak
- 225g/8oz mushrooms
- 1 tbsp Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tsp tomato purée
- Salt & ground black pepper
- 2 tbsp soured cream
- Chervil sprigs to garnish



Method

1. Preheat oven to 200°C/400°F/Gas mark 6. Using a large biscuit cutter or large mug/cup, cut the bread into rounds and soak in 50g/2oz melted butter. Using two 4-cup Yorkshire Pudding tins, put the rounds in one tin and cover with the other so the bread retains its shape. Alternatively, blind bake with greaseproof paper and rice.
2. Bake for 10 minutes, remove top tin/paper & rice and bake for a further 10 minutes until brown and crispy.
3. In the meantime, slice the gammon into short sticks and chop the mushrooms. Fry the onions and gammon in the remaining butter until lightly browned. Add the mushrooms and fry quickly to brown, then reduce heat to cook slowly until all the juices have evaporated. Gently stir in Worcestershire sauce and tomato purée and season to taste.
4. When cooked, fill the toasted rounds with the mixture. Add a spoonful of soured cream on top, garnish with chervil sprigs and serve.

You can always omit the bread rounds if you want to be a bit healthier, either way, this is a very tasty starter.

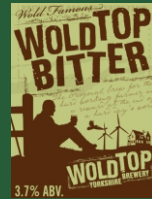
