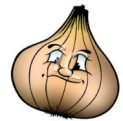
RUDSTON VILLAGE HALL

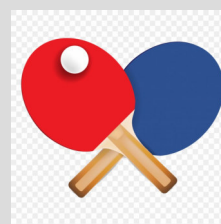
We hope to have a pre-Christmas Coffee Morning again this year. Date and venue to be confirmed so please look out for posters and fliers nearer to December.

Matters from Rudston Parish Council Meeting 12/10/2022

Condition of Paths around the village

The condition of paths in the village is a matter that has been raised many times at Parish Council meetings. This matter was discussed again at last month's meeting having been raised by some residents in the village. The Council will be addressing the matter once again with East Riding of Yorkshire Council and requesting that they take urgent action to make safe the paths in the village, which have become a serious Health & Safety risk.

The Parish Council would like to ask for your help to reinforce our request for urgent action by reporting the matter directly with East Riding of Yorkshire Council, either by contacting them by telephone, or reporting on their website.

Litter Bins in the village

The Parish Council discussed the amount of litter bins within the village and agreed that additional bins would be a benefit. The cost of a new bin from ERYC is £326.59 and £115.00 for installation which, including VAT is a total of £529.91 per bin.

After much negotiation by one of our Councillors, we have an offer from ERYC for a free new bin to be sited next to the bus shelter on Long Street. We also propose to re-site one of the two bins from the play park, to the parking area opposite the sports field on Burton Fleming Road. ERYC have agreed to re-site this bin for a small charge, which has already been covered by funds raised by Councillor Coates.

Following the meeting, it has been mentioned that both the bins at the play park may belong to the play park. However, the play park does come under the umbrella of the Parish Council. As this is a contentious matter, we are hoping for some

feedback from residents in the village on their views about moving one of the bins. This will provide us with an indication of an overall view and allow us to form a decision based on the survey answers.

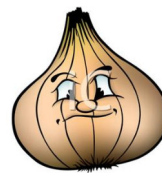
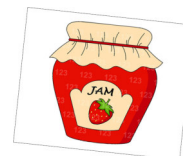

The answers to the quiz this month are both man made and natural - can you work out what they are?

1. If you're stood on the Maid of the Mist, you'll be able to watch me fall.
2. I opened to the public in 1932, with construction having taken around 8 years. I'm known locally as the Coathanger and you can see me on TV every New Year's Eve.
3. Built during the 17th Century in the Agra District of Uttar Pradesh, I was built in memory of Emperor Shah Jahan's favourite wife.
4. According to legend, Irish chief Fionn mac Cumhail (Finn McCool) is said to have created me to get to Benandonner.
5. I was built in the 15th Century by the Inca's and am Peru's most popular tourist attraction, standing 2,430m above sea level.
6. Known locally as Mosi-o-Tunya "The smoke that thunders", I am the largest curtain of falling water in the world with more than 500 million litres of water descending per minute.
7. Now a popular tourist attraction, I was established by Nabateans, an Arab Bedouin tribe and have been used in many films including Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade.
8. I stand 30m high on top of Mount Corcovado and gaze over Sugarloaf Mountain and the Atlantic Ocean.
9. British architect, Norman Foster designed me with 7 pillars which stand at 343m tall at the highest point making me the tallest in the world.
10. I am one of this country's most recognisable natural landmarks and am sacred to the Pitjantjatjara. I am known by two names and appear to stand all alone.
11. I am 45 ft thick at the top and 660 ft thick at the bottom and was pivotal in forming the largest manmade reservoir in the US.
12. Construction started on me in 1859 and I finally opened in 1869 after 120,000 deaths among the 1.5 million workers. I'm still open today although I did get blocked last year.
13. Work started on me around 70-72 AD and I opened in 80 AD. I was built 4 storeys high and with 80 entrances.
14. Flanked by Devil's Peak and Lion's Head, you can reach me either by hiking or as most prefer, by cable car. I was originally named Taboa do Cabo and the view from the top is amazing, provided it's not cloudy.

STATE OF FOOTPATHS

After attending the Parish Council meeting last night, Wednesday 12 October, I felt as if nothing would be done about the pavements in Rudston. I have lived in Rudston since May 1989 and over the last few months have been disappointed with how scruffy the whole village is looking. Rudston has a world famous monolith in the Church yard and a famous author, Winifred Holtby, lived in the village; she wrote 'South Riding'.

1. The Gypsy Race is a mess. I was told by someone visiting the village that the Gypsy Race was the most northern chalk stream in the British Isles – surely it merits some recognition? When we moved out to Rudston there was a Duck Race about Easter time, this was a very popular event for a few years, with the state of the stream now it would not be possible. Trees have grown over the Gypsy Race and it is now a dark walk with bad lighting at night after attending events at the Village Hall – not the pleasant walk that it once was – a Health & Safety problem? Lighting?

2. The pavements all over the village are poor and many are dangerous – Health & Safety problem! We get quite a few visitors walking around the village and going to the Bosville Arms for a meal. In the 1980's the pavements were given a treatment which did much more damage and made the paths very difficult to walk on – they still are bad – nothing has been done. All paths are now so narrow particularly Church Hill, the only road up to the Church with a path. People do not use the path. When a car comes up or down they have to climb up onto the path! Another Health & Safety problem!

3. SatNav is directing traffic down Church Lane & East Gate as the direct route – most unsuitable. There is a small bridge over the Gypsy Race at an angle, a bad bend and narrow road which people walk on rather than use the path. Furthermore, on the run up to the bridge on East Gate, this area regularly gets congested with parked vehicles. A lot of bikes come down Church Hill and along East Gate as well as children on horses. The road is not suitable for motorhomes and caravans to use when they could go straight down Long Street to the B1253 and then turn right for the caravan park. The villagers are just waiting for an accident to happen on the bad bend. Even the postmen who work in Rudston say the pavements are bad.

Repairs that need doing

All pavements around the village need checking and repairs carrying out where they are broken and uneven.

East Gate extension – the post is rotten on the stile. Also a hole in the road which has doubled in size this year

Footpath to Village Hall – The railing running along the side of the Gypsy Race is damaged from when the tree fell down

East Riding of Yorkshire Council staff walk around the village, but the jobs still do not get done.

Rudston's Recipes

MUSHROOM SOUP (Serves 6) Ingredients

- 1lb button mushrooms, wiped and thickly sliced
- 1 onion, chopped
- 2 oz butter or margarine
- 2 oz plain flour
- ½ pint milk
- 1 pint chicken stock, made with stock cube
- 2 tablespoons sherry
- Salt and pepper to taste

Method

- Melt the butter or margarine in a saucepan, cook the onion until softened.
- Add the mushrooms and cook gently for a few minutes. Stir in the flour.
- Gradually blend in the milk and stock. Bring to the boil.
- Reduce to a gentle simmer. Stir in the sherry.
- Cook for 20 minutes, stirring frequently.
- Season to taste and then blend - I find a stick blender the best way to do this.

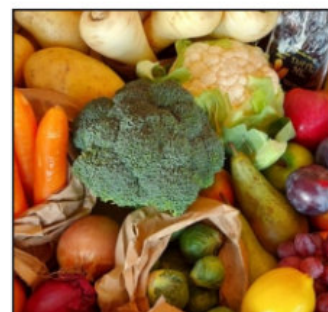
