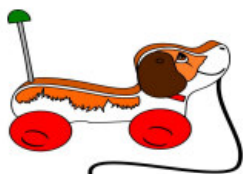

Rudston Tennis Club



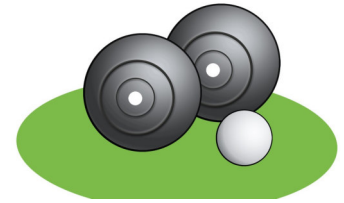
Social tennis continues on Sunday mornings 10am onwards weather permitting - check our Facebook page. There has been a good turnout this Autumn and we always welcome new faces.

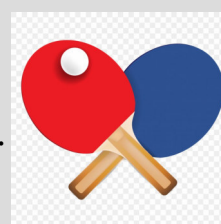
Report of some of the New Year’s Parties

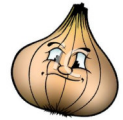

RUDSTON YOUTH CLUB

Children in Rudston and the surrounding villages are enjoying the recently reformed Youth Club at the Village Hall. Run by volunteers and a newly elected Committee, the Youth Club meets on the 2nd Tuesday of each month from 6.30pm - 8pm and is aimed at children aged 8-17 yrs.

Each month the children are invited to participate in an activity whereby they can learn new skills, whether that be crafting, baking or trying new sports with the aim of nurturing confidence through making new friends in a safe and informal setting. 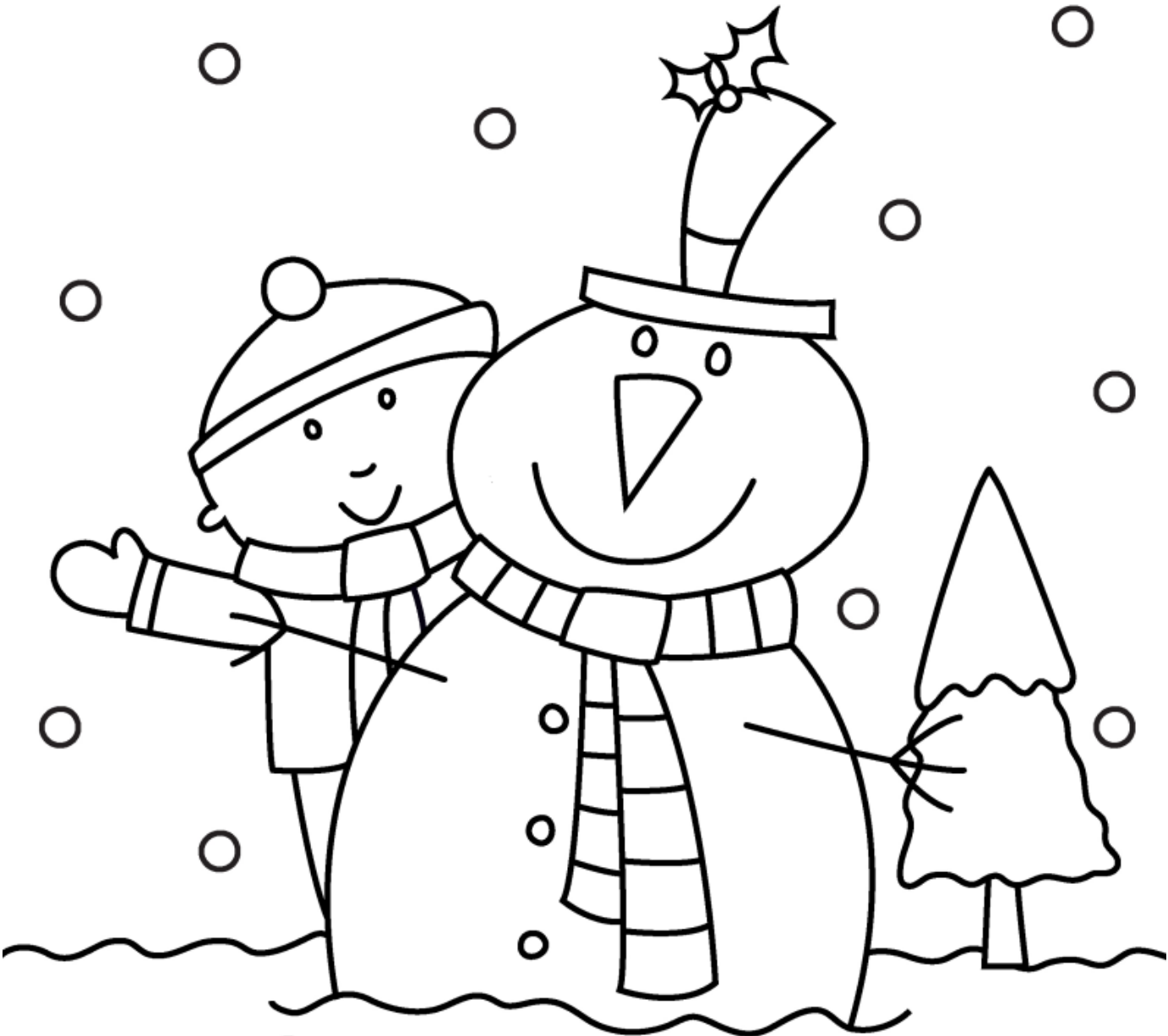

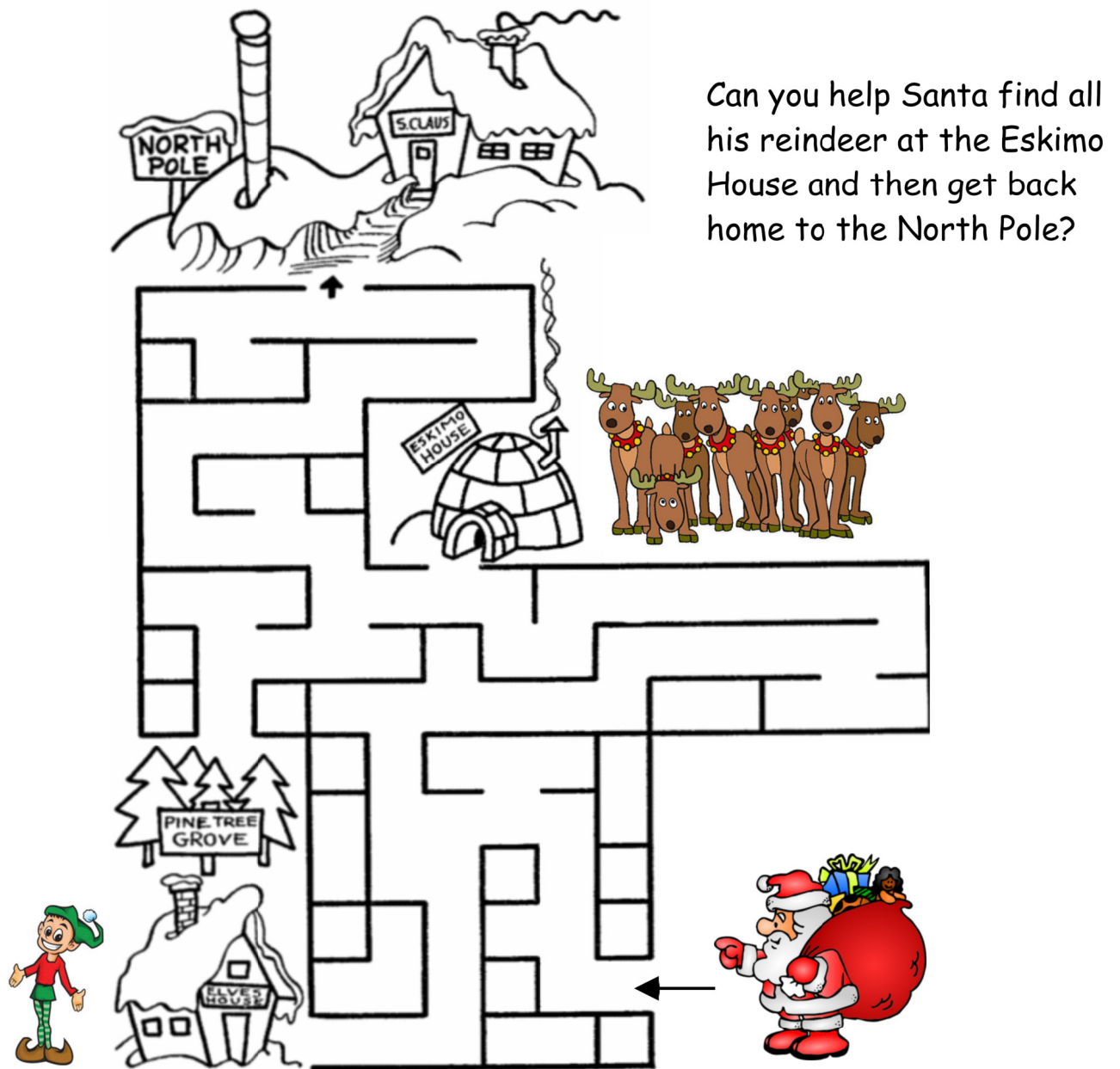

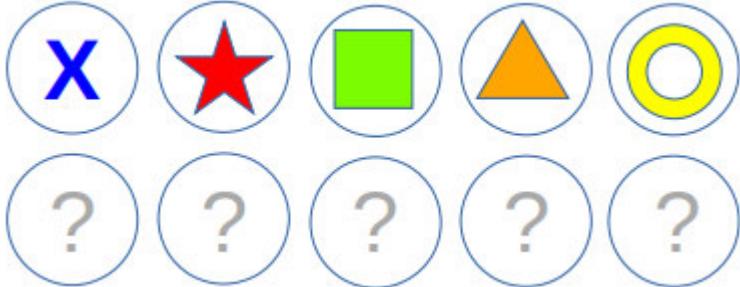

Rudston's Recipes

CHRISTMAS STUFFING

This is sufficient for 8-9 people, halve recipe if less required

Ingredients

Buy a large plain loaf 3-4 days before needed (do not freeze)
3-4 large onions, or 6 small
2-4 pork sausage meat rolls
Salt, pepper, mixed herbs (to taste or whatever you fancy)
Onion gravy granules approx. 2 tbsp (plain granules will do)
Block of cheap margarine
1 roasting tin

Day before

- Cut off all crusts as thinly as possible and cut bread into cubes and store in a bag (not necessary to keep in a bread bin)
- Peel onions and dice as finely as possible and leave overnight in a pan of water ready for cooking the next day

Method

- Boil onions until soft. Put cubed bread in a large bowl and add the onion water slowly to the bread. Mix with a fork (do not over wet the bread or else it will take much longer to cook).
- Add sausage meat a little at a time to the soaked bread, and add onions to the mixture, stirring in with the fork and season to taste. If the mixture is very stiff you may have to add a small amount of boiled water.
- Preheat oven to gas mark 6, fan oven 180°C. Grease the sides of the tin with the margarine and place half the margarine in the base to melt. When melted, pour in the mixture and level off. Stir every 15 -20 minutes to prevent it sticking to the bottom and sides, and to ensure it cools evenly.

It will take 2-3 hours to cook. When cooked, put in a large dish to cool.

Christmas Morning

- Put into the bottom of the oven about 30 minutes before needed, stirring every 10 minutes to crisp it up

MALVERN PUDDING

Ingredients

1lb cooking apples, prepared
1oz sugar
1oz butter
Rind of 1 lemon

2oz Demerara sugar
Little extra butter

Sauce: 1oz butter
1oz flour
1oz sugar
 $\frac{3}{4}$ pint milk
1 egg, beaten

Method

- Cook the apples with the sugar, butter and lemon rind
- Make a sauce with the butter, flour, milk, and sugar. Allow to cool a little and then beat the egg into sauce
- Put the apples into a shallow grillproof dish and cover with the sauce. Sprinkle the Demerara sugar over, dot with butter and put under a hot grill to caramelize the sugar
- Cool, serve well chilled with thick cream

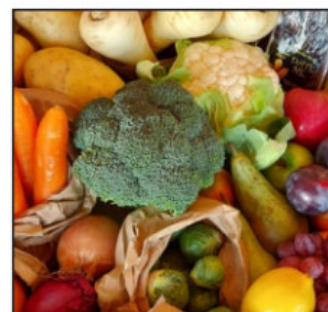
