Rudston's Recipes

BEST EVER CHRISTMAS LEFTOVERS SANDWICH

Ingredients

- 2 cold leftover roast potatoes
- 2 tsp sunflower or olive oil
- 50g leftover stuffing
- 2 leftover pigs in blankets, halved lengthways, plus an extra one for the top if you like
- 2-4 thick slices leftover roast turkey (about 100g)
- 1 tbsp wholegrain mustard
- 2 tbsp mayonnaise
- 2 slices of bread (we used seeded)
- 2 tbsp cranberry sauce
- 2 tbsp pickled red cabbage or use leftover braised cabbage
- Handful of baby spinach or other salad leaves
- Hot gravy, for dipping (optional)

Method

- Put the potatoes on a chopping board and gently squash them with a potato masher. Try not to break them up too much, just squash them enough to flatten.
- Heat the oil in a frying pan over a medium heat and fry the potatoes for 5 minutes on each side, or until hot and crispy. Keep warm while you reheat the stuffing, pigs in blankets and turkey in the microwave or pan.
- Mix the mustard and mayonnaise together in a bowl, and spread over one slice of the bread (you don't need to butter it unless you are using sourdough or granary bread). Spread the cranberry sauce over the other slice. Top the mayonnaise with the pickled red cabbage, crispy roast potatoes, stuffing, turkey, pigs in blankets and a handful of spinach.
- Finally, press the cranberry-sauce-topped slice of bread on top of the sandwich. You can secure it with a skewer and top with a pig in blanket if you have another one left over.
- Serve with a bowl of gravy for dipping, if you like.

Rudston's Recipes (continued)



SHERRY TRIFLE

Ingredients

3 x 190g / 6.7 oz jam swiss rolls (the ones with jam only, not the ones with cream in)
200g / 7 oz fresh raspberries (you can use frozen, but don't defrost first)
2 x 135g / 4.8 oz packs of raspberry jelly cubes
3 tbsp sherry
70g / 7 level tbsp custard powder
70g / 5½ level tbsp caster sugar
1 litre / 1¾ pints full-fat milk
600ml / 2½ cups whipping cream
1 tsp vanilla extract
30g / 4½ level tbsp icing sugar (confectioners' sugar/powdered sugar)
1 tbsp rainbow sprinkles

Method

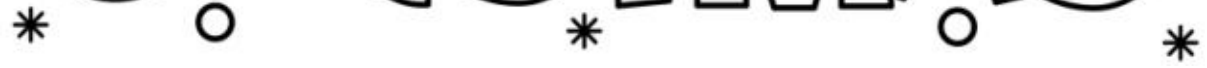
- Slice up 2 of the swiss rolls into 1cm thick slices. Use it to line the side of a 3.5-litre trifle dish - just one layer. If you have any leftovers, put to one side and cover for now.
- Add the raspberries to the centre of the trifle dish.
- Slice up the jelly cubes and place them in a bowl or jug. Add 400ml of boiling water and stir together until the jelly cubes have dissolved. Add 500ml of cold water and stir together.
- Pour this jelly mixture into the trifle dish, over the raspberries and swiss roll. Place in the refrigerator to set for at least 4 hours (up to 2 days). Once the jelly has set, take it out of the refrigerator.
- Chop the remaining swiss rolls into chunky pieces, approx. 1-1.5cm cubed. Place in a bowl and drizzle over the sherry - try to ensure a little bit of sherry gets onto each piece.
- Arrange the sponge pieces over the top of the jelly and place back in the fridge while you make the custard.
- Place the custard powder, sugar and 4 tbsp of the milk into a saucepan. Stir together to form a paste. Now slowly pour in the remaining milk, while stirring, until fully mixed together.
- Put the heat on under the pan and heat over a medium heat, stirring constantly with a whisk or wooden spoon, until the custard thickens (be sure to keep stirring, otherwise the custard can catch and burn at the bottom of the pan). It will thicken quite quickly just as it's starting to approach boiling point. As soon as it thickens, turn off the heat.
- Leave to cool to room temperature - about 20-30 minutes. If you want to prevent any skin from forming, place a piece of clingfilm on top (touching all exposed parts of the custard) when cooling.
- Remove the clingfilm and give the custard a stir. Take the trifle out of the fridge and pour/spoon the custard over the top, to completely cover the sponge pieces in custard.
- Place back in the fridge for 1 hour to chill the custard (again, cover with clingfilm if you wish to prevent a skin from forming. This is optional).
- Add the whipping cream to a large bowl or stand mixer. Whisk using a hand whisk or the whisk attachment on your stand mixer until you get to the soft peaks stage (the cream should look soft, thick and pillowy, and will just stay on a spoon if you turn a spoonful of it upside-down).
- Add the vanilla extract and then sift over the icing sugar. Whisk again for a few seconds to combine the vanilla and icing sugar into the cream. Spoon the cream over the top of the trifle in big dollops. Sprinkle over the rainbow sprinkles, then serve.

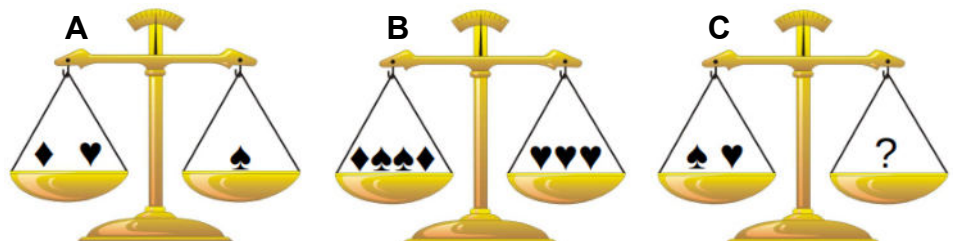

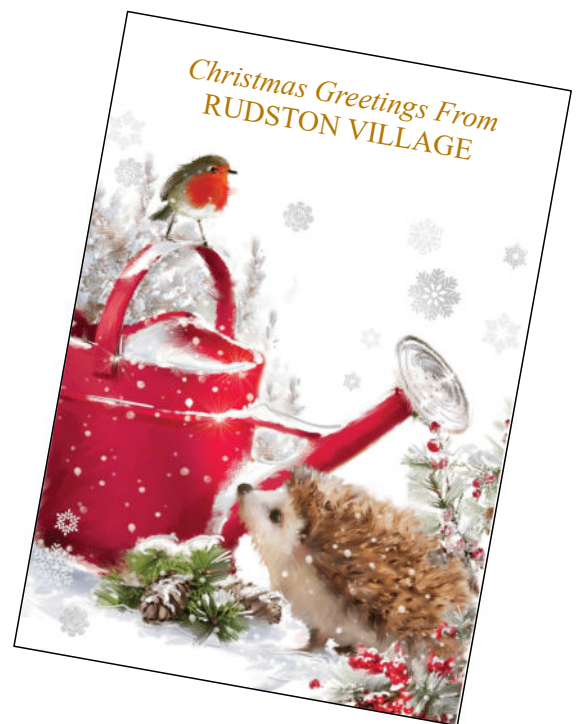



2. 9 - A heart and a diamond weigh the same as a spade (scale A), so replace the 2 spades in scale B with 2 hearts and 2 diamonds; thus making 2 hearts and 4 diamonds balance 3 hearts. Cancelling out 2 hearts from either side of scale B (because they weigh the same) shows that 4 diamonds weigh the same as 1 heart. Now replace the heart in scale A with 4 diamonds, so that 5 diamonds weigh the same as 1 spade. In scale C, there is 1 heart (= to 4 diamonds) and 1 spade (= to 5 diamonds), so a total of 9 diamonds are needed to balance scale C.
