## **RUDSTON PARISH COUNCIL**

Rudston Parish Council held its annual meetings on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> May, and we're pleased to share that two members of the public attended the Annual Parish Meeting. We'd like to extend our sincere thanks to both attendees - your interest and support are greatly appreciated.

At our March Parish Council meeting, we welcomed a member of the public who attended to learn more about the Precept, a topic that had been raised within the community. In response, we've included some information below to help explain what the Precept is and how it works.

#### **UNDERSTANDING THE PARISH COUNCIL PRECEPT**

A quick guide to what it is, how it's calculated, and how it benefits your community.

#### What is the Parish Council Precept?

The Precept is the Parish Council's share of your Council Tax. It provides funding for the Parish Council to carry out its work and deliver services in your local area.

#### How is it calculated?

Each year, the Parish Council:

- 1. Reviews the services, projects, and upkeep it plans to deliver.
- 2. Works out how much this will cost.
- 3. Subtracts any income it expects (from grants, donations, etc.).

4. The remaining amount is what it asks the District Council to collect through the Council Tax - this is the Precept.

This total is shared between local households, based on their Council Tax band.

#### What is it used for?

The Precept helps fund a range of local services and improvements, such as:

- Maintaining play areas, open spaces, memorials.
- Providing noticeboards, signs and defibrillators.
- Supporting community events, local groups and village initiatives.
- Commenting on planning applications.
- Speaking up for the community on local issues.

#### Why does it matter?

Your Precept helps keep the community a great place to live. It enables the Parish Council to respond to local needs, maintain public spaces and invest in village life.

Opposite is a breakdown of how the Precept was spent in the 2024/2025 Financial Year.

A Mischief of Rats 3rd May to 30th August across Hull and East Yorkshire



2025 really is the Year of the Rat in Hull and East Yorkshire (apologies to the Chinese Horoscope) as a unique parade of 45 beautiful, artist decorated giant Rat sculptures creates a Pied Piper ripple of excitement across the area!

The story behind A Mischief of Rats is a very special one and has a poignant link to the work of our chosen charity, Daisy Appeal, a charity which provides life-saving technology to support people living with cancer, heart disease and dementia.

Inspiration comes from Hull band, The Rats, who were prominent on the local music scene and beyond in the late 60s and early 70s. Lead guitarist Mick Ronson, bassist Trevor Bolder and drummer Woody Woodmansey went on to form David Bowie's 'Spiders from Mars'.

Sadly both Mick and Trevor died of cancer, and so it is fitting that a charity focusing on the early diagnosis of cancers, heart disease and dementia should benefit from this project.

## **Rudston's Recipes**

## **CHEDDAR & RED ONION TARTLETS**

#### Ingredients

320g/11½oz ready-rolled shortcrust pastry sheet 1 free-range egg 150ml/5fl oz double cream 100g/3½oz mature cheddar, grated 1 small red onion, thinly sliced Salt and freshly ground black pepper

#### Method

- Preheat the oven to 200°C/180°C Fan/Gas 6.
- Open the pastry sheet and stamp out six rounds with a 10-11cm/4-4¼in cutter (keep the trimmings for use in another recipe).
- Use the pastry rounds to line a six-hole muffin tin (it will ripple along the sides) and prick the bases with a fork. Crumple up six squares of baking paper and use to line the tart cases. Fill with baking beans or dried rice and bake for 8 minutes. Remove the paper and beans, then bake for a further 5 minutes until the pastry is set.
- Meanwhile, beat the egg and cream together in a jug and season with salt and pepper. Layer the cheese and red onion into the cases then carefully pour in the egg mixture.
- Bake for 20-25 minutes until the filling is golden and set. Leave to cool in the tin for 5 minutes before carefully lifting out.

#### **Recipe Tips**

These tartlets can be made with any type of onion, including shallots and spring onions.

Any trimmings can be re-rolled, cut into small shapes and baked to make savoury crackers.

Try scattering with grated cheese, a sprinkle of cayenne pepper or paprika or some seeds, such as sesame, poppy or nigella before baking.

### **Rudston's Recipes (continued)**

#### CHICKEN CAESAR PASTA SALAD

#### Ingredients

4 chicken thighs, skinless and boneless
500ml/18fl oz hot chicken stock
320g/11oz farfalle
2 handfuls plain croûtons
1 Little Gem lettuce, finely shredded
Small handful Parmesan shavings
Sea salt and freshly ground black pepper

#### For the Caesar dressing

- 4 anchovy fillets in oil, drained
- 3 tbsp light mayonnaise
- 2 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- 2 tsp red wine vinegar
- 1/4 lemon, juice only

#### Method

- Put the chicken and the hot stock into a saucepan and bring to the boil over a high heat. Reduce the heat to low and simmer for 10–15 minutes, until just cooked through. Using a slotted spoon, remove the chicken from the pan and set aside to cool.
- Add the pasta bows to the pan along with a generous pinch of sea salt. Top up with boiling water if necessary and cook the pasta according to the packet instructions.
   Drain the pasta and rinse under the cold tap. Set aside to drain.
- To make the Caesar dressing, put all the ingredients except for the lemon juice in a mini chopper or food processor, season generously with salt and pepper and blitz until smooth. Add the lemon juice to taste.
- Roughly chop the chicken and stir into the pasta along with the dressing, croûtons, shredded lettuce and most of the Parmesan, until the pasta is well coated. Season with more black pepper to taste.
- Divide the pasta salad between four bowls and garnish with the reserved Parmesan shavings.

# GARDENING

#### 🏫 Flower Garden

Deadhead bedding plants and perennials to encourage more blooms.
Cut back spring-flowering perennials if they've finished.
Support tall or floppy plants (like delphiniums or peonies) with stakes or frames.
Sow biennials such as foxgloves, wallflowers, and sweet Williams for next year.

Plant out summer bedding if not already done.

Trim evergreen hedges like box and privet.

## <u> Fruit & Vegetable Garden</u>

Earth up potatoes to protect from light and boost yield.
Keep sowing salad crops every 2 weeks (lettuce, radish, beetroot).
Pinch outside shoots on cordon tomatoes to promote fruiting.
Protect strawberries from birds using netting; harvest as they ripen.
Thin out apples and pears to improve fruit size and quality.
Sow winter veg like kale, leeks, and sprouting broccoli.

Keep an eye out for pests like aphids, caterpillars, and carrot fly.

#### <u> 🌿 General Garden Maintenance</u>

Water regularly, especially containers and newly planted items.

Mulch borders to retain moisture during dry spells.

**Feed plants** with a general-purpose or tomato feed (especially fruiting/flowering plants).

Mow the lawn weekly, but avoid cutting it too short in dry weather.

Weed frequently to prevent competition for water and nutrients.

Clean out greenhouses and ventilate daily to prevent overheating.
