

GARDENING

Ornamental Garden:

Deadhead late-flowering perennials like rudbeckia and echinacea to extend the bloom period.

Divide perennials such as hostas and daylilies to rejuvenate them and increase stock.

Plant spring bulbs like daffodils and crocuses for a vibrant spring display.

Vegetables & Fruit:

Harvest apples, plums, and pears before they over-ripen.

Cut back summer-fruiting raspberry canes that have finished cropping.

Sow green manures (e.g. mustard or clover) to enrich soil.



Lawns & Maintenance:

Scarify and **aerate** lawns to relieve compaction and remove moss. **Feed** lawns with autumn fertiliser (low nitrogen, high potassium).

Wildlife Tip: Leave some windfall fruit for birds and insects.

Wildlife Tips for September

1. Help Hedgehogs Prepare for Hibernation

Leave out shallow dishes of water and meaty cat food (not fish-based) to help hedgehogs fatten up before hibernation. Avoid using slug pellets – they're toxic to hedgehogs and other wildlife.





2. Leave Seed Heads for Birds

If you've been dead heading flowers all summer, now's a good time to stop. Many seed heads, like sunflowers and teasels, provide valuable food for finches and other birds.

3. Create a Log Pile or Wildlife Corner

Fallen branches, stacked logs or a quiet corner of the garden can become a haven for frogs, toads, insects and even overwintering hedgehogs.



4. Clean Out Bird Feeders and Nest Boxes

Give feeders and nest boxes a good scrub with boiling water (no chemicals) to prevent disease and prepare for winter use.


5. Watch for Migrating Birds

September is a great month to spot swallows and house martins gathering on wires before Their journey south – and to welcome back Winter visitors like redwings and fieldfares later in the month.



6. Don't Be Too Tidy

A slightly scruffy garden is a wildlife paradise. Leaving leaf piles, seed heads and overgrown areas can provide food and shelter for a wide range of creatures.

Rudston's Recipes

ROASTED BUTTERNUT SQUASH & BEETROOT SALAD WITH FETA & WALNUTS

Ingredients

1 small butternut squash, peeled and cubed
2 medium beetroots, peeled and cubed
2 tbsp olive oil
Salt & pepper
100g feta cheese, crumbled
A handful of walnut halves
A couple of handfuls of fresh rocket
1 tsp Dijon mustard
1 tbsp balsamic vinegar
1 tbsp honey (optional)

Method

- Preheat oven to 200°C / 180°C fan
- Toss squash and beetroot in olive oil, season and roast for 30-35 minutes until tender and caramelised.
- Toast walnuts in a dry pan for 2-3 minutes until golden.
- Whisk mustard, balsamic and honey (if using) to make a dressing.
- Toss rocket, roasted veg, feta and walnuts together.
- Drizzle with dressing and serve warm or at room temperature.

Rudston's Recipes (continued)

PLUM AND APPLE CRUMBLE

Ingredients - Serves 6

4 cooking apples (e.g. Bramley), peeled and sliced

6 ripe plums, halved and stoned

100g caster sugar

1 tsp ground cinnamon (optional)

For the crumble topping:

150g plain flour

100g cold butter, cubed

75g demerara or soft brown sugar

50g oats (optional, for extra crunch)

Method

- Preheat oven to 190°C / 170°C fan.
- Place fruit in a baking dish, sprinkle with sugar and cinnamon.
- Rub flour and butter together to form crumbs. Stir in sugar and oats.
- Spread crumble mixture evenly over fruit.
- Bake for 35-40 minutes until golden and bubbling.
- Serve with custard, cream or ice cream.
