Are you passionate about our community and keen to make a real difference? Rudston Parish Council is looking for enthusiastic, committed people of all ages and backgrounds to join the team. If this sounds like you, we'd love you to put yourself forward for co-option.

Rudston Parish Council has 11 councillor positions, and with several vacancies now available, we have the opportunity to welcome new voices and fresh ideas. As no election has been called, East Riding of Yorkshire Council has given permission for us to fill these vacancies by co-option.

What does co-option mean? It's a simple process where local residents put their names forward, and at a Parish Council meeting the current councillors decide who to co-opt. The powers of a co-opted councillor are exactly the same as those of an elected councillor.

How to apply If you are interested? Please contact the Clerk or any current Parish Councillor to express your interest. A short supporting note with some background about yourself, and why you'd like to be considered, would also be helpful. Having a current Parish Councillor prepared to propose your application would be a great benefit.

All expressions of interest will be shared with the Council and added to the agenda for the next meeting, where councillors will make their decision following a discussion with shortlisted candidates.

Wind Turbine Plans

Are you aware of the plans for a commercial onshore wind farm next to Woldgate?

In July, wind farm developer Ridge Clean Energy distributed flyers to residents of Rudston, Burton Agnes and Carnaby outlining plans for six 150 metre (492 ft) turbines in a field near the top of Woldgate. Three exhibitions were held at the respective village halls so that people could view the proposals and make comments.

The national and regional media published stories after a group of concerned villagers contacted them, culminating in a piece on BBC Look North.

Ridge Clean Energy will submit a formal planning application to East Riding of Yorkshire Council in November. If the development is given the green light, these will be some of the largest onshore wind turbines in England.

Concerns include:

- The visual, noise and health impact
- Negative affect on house prices
- Erosion of the peace and tranquillity of the area
- Impact on the visitor destinations of Woldgate, made famous by artist David Hockney, along with Burton Agnes Hall and the nationally important Rudston Monolith
- The impact on nature which is supported by the woods on and around Woldgate

Ridge Clean Energy say they will distribute a fund for community initiatives over the next 40 years, some of which will be used as an energy rebate for those worst affected.

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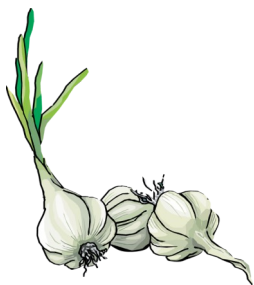
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GARDENING JOBS FOR OCTOBER

Ornamental Garden:

- **Plant tulips** and alliums for late-spring colour.
- **Lift and store** tender bulbs like dahlias, gladioli, and begonias once foliage dies down.
- Cut back faded perennials and compost healthy material.

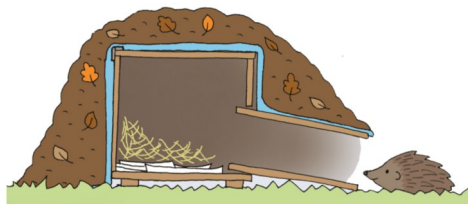


Vegetables & Fruit:

- Clear out spent vegetable plants and add compost.
- Sow garlic and overwintering onion sets.
- Protect winter brassicas with netting against pigeons.

Lawns & Maintenance:

- **Last mow** of the season - set blade high.
- Clean and cover garden furniture and BBQs.

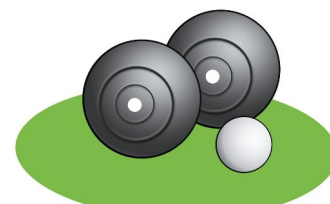


Wildlife Tip:

Create a **hedgehog shelter** with leaves and logs.

Wildlife Tips for October

1. Help Hedgehogs Prepare for Hibernation

Leave a small pile of leaves, twigs, and logs in a quiet corner as shelter. Put out fresh water and meaty cat or dog food (never milk or bread) for late-feeding hedgehogs.



2. Leave Seed Heads for Birds

Resist the urge to cut down all spent flowers - seedheads from sunflowers, teasels and coneflowers provide food for finches and sparrows.

3. Create a mini leaf pile for insects

Leaf litter is a home for beetles, spiders and other beneficial bugs. This, in turn, feeds birds during the winter.



4. Watch for autumn migrants

Look out for redwings and fieldfares arriving from Scandinavia. Swallows and house martins may still be passing through on their journey south.

5. Plant for pollinators

Ivy flowers are a late-season feast for bees, hoverflies, and butterflies. If you have ivy, let it bloom before trimming.

6. Keep ponds leaf-free but not wildlife-free

Use netting to stop too many leaves falling in, but leave some natural cover at the edges for frogs and newts.



7. Listen for tawny owls

This is their main courtship season – you might hear the classic “twit” and “twoo” calls in the evening.



Rudston's Recipes

PUMPKIN & SAGE MACARONI BAKE

Ingredients

- 300g macaroni or short pasta
 - 500g pumpkin (peeled and cubed)
 - 1 onion, finely chopped
 - 2 garlic cloves, minced
 - 25g butter
 - 2 tbsp plain flour
 - 500ml milk
 - 100g mature cheddar, grated
 - 1 tsp chopped fresh sage (or ½ tsp dried)
 - Salt & pepper
- Optional topping: breadcrumbs mixed with grated parmesan

Method

- Preheat oven to 200°C / 180°C fan
- Cook pumpkin cubes in boiling water for 10 mins until soft. Drain and mash.
- Cook pasta until just al dente. Drain and set aside.
- In a saucepan, melt butter, then fry onion and garlic until soft.
- Stir in flour and cook for 1 minute, then gradually whisk in milk.
- Stir in mashed pumpkin, cheddar, sage, salt and pepper.
- Combine with pasta and pour into a baking dish.
- Top with breadcrumbs/parmesan if using. Bake for 20-25 mins until golden and bubbling.

HAS ANYONE SEEN GANDALF THE CAT?

Rudston's Recipes (continued)

TOFFEE APPLE TRAYBAKE

Ingredients - Serves 12

2 eating apples, peeled and chopped
200g light brown sugar
200g butter, softened
200g self-raising flour
1 tsp baking powder
1 tsp cinnamon
3 large eggs
2 tbsp milk
100g toffees or soft caramel sweets
A splash of cream (for the sauce)

Method

- Preheat oven to 180°C (160°C fan). Grease and line a 20cm square baking tin.
- Beat butter and sugar together until fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time.
- Fold in flour, baking powder, cinnamon and milk.
- Stir in chopped apples.
- Pour into tin and bake for 30-35 minutes until golden and springy.
- Meanwhile, melt toffees with a splash of cream to make a sauce.
- Drizzle toffee sauce over the cooled traybake. Slice and serve.
