

Join Our Local Team - Become a Parish Councillor

Are you passionate about our community and keen to make a real difference? Rudston Parish Council is looking for enthusiastic, committed people of all ages and backgrounds to join the team. If this sounds like you, we'd love you to put yourself forward for co-option.

Rudston Parish Council has 11 councillor positions, and with several vacancies now available, we have the opportunity to welcome new voices and fresh ideas. As no election has been called, East Riding of Yorkshire Council has given permission for us to fill these vacancies by co-option.

What does co-option mean? It's a simple process where local residents put their names forward, and at a Parish Council meeting the current councillors decide who to co-opt. The powers of a co-opted councillor are exactly the same as those of an elected councillor.

How to apply If you are interested? Please contact the Clerk or any current Parish Councillor to express your interest. A short supporting note with some background about yourself, and why you'd like to be considered, would also be helpful. Having a current Parish Councillor prepared to propose your application would be a great benefit.

All expressions of interest will be shared with the Council and added to the agenda for the next meeting, where councillors will make their decision following a discussion with shortlisted candidates.

**** GARDENING JOBS FOR NOVEMBER ****

Ornamental Garden:

- **Plant bare-root** roses, hedging and trees while dormant.
- Continue leaf clearing to prevent slippery paths and lawns.
- Mulch borders to insulate roots and suppress weeds.



Vegetables & Fruit:

- Prune blackcurrants, gooseberries and apples/pears (avoid stone fruits).
- Add manure to empty veg beds to improve soil structure.





Insulate with bubble wrap. Reduce watering and ventilate on mild days.

Wildlife Tip:

Set up bird feeders and clean birdbaths regularly.


Finally, a reminder that our next youth club meeting will be on Tuesday 11th November at the Village Hall from 6:30-8:00pm.

We're sorry we couldn't attend the Village Hall AGM, but we wanted to send a huge thank you to the Village Hall Committee and to everyone who volunteers.



Wildlife Tips for November

1. Feed the birds early

Natural food is scarce now, so put out seed, suet and fresh water. A morning feed helps small birds keep warm through chilly nights.

2. Look out for winter thrushes

Redwings and fieldfares are here in good numbers now, stripping berries from hawthorn and holly.

3. Keep a leaf pile

Fallen leaves shelter insects, frogs and hibernating hedgehogs. Pile some in a quiet garden corner rather than bagging them all up.

4. Help hedgehogs before hibernation

If you see one out in the day looking underweight, contact a local rescue. Healthy adults should weigh at least 600g before winter sleep.

5. Don't tidy ivy just yet

Ivy flowers and berries are vital food for late-flying insects and many winter birds.

6. Watch for starling murmurations

On still evenings, look for swirling clouds of starlings heading to roost – sometimes large flocks gather along the Yorkshire coast.

7. Check bonfire piles before lighting

Hedgehogs, frogs and toads often crawl in for shelter. Rebuild the stack right before lighting to keep them safe.

Rudston's Recipes

STICKY BONFIRE SAUSAGES WITH CARAMELISED ONIONS

Ingredients

8 good quality pork sausages
2 red onions, finely sliced
2 tbsp balsamic vinegar
1 tbsp brown sugar
2 tbsp wholegrain mustard
2 tbsp honey
1 tbsp oil
Salt & pepper

Optional: Serve with mash or roasted parsnips

Method

- Preheat oven to 200°C / 180°C fan / Gas mark 6.
- Mix mustard, honey and a little oil in a bowl.
- Place sausages in a baking dish, drizzle with the glaze and roast for 30-35 minutes, turning halfway.
- While sausages roast, cook onions in a little oil over low heat until soft (about 15 minutes).
- Add balsamic vinegar & sugar and cook for another 5 minutes until sticky.
- Serve sausages in buns or with mash, topped with the onions.

Rudston's Recipes (continued)

TREACLE TOFFEE APPLE CAKE

Ingredients (Serves 8-10)

200g self-raising flour 100g light brown sugar 100g butter, softened 2 eggs 2 tbsp black treacle

2 apples, peeled & chopped 1 tsp cinnamon ½ tsp mixed spice A splash of milk

For the topping:

100g soft toffees 2 tbsp cream or milk

Method

- Preheat oven to 180°C / 160°C fan / Gas mark 4.
- Grease and line a loaf or 20cm round tin.
- Beat butter and sugar until fluffy.
- Add eggs, then stir in treacle.
- Fold in flour, spices, chopped apples and enough milk to make a dropping consistency.
- Bake for 40-45 mins or until a skewer comes out clean.
- Melt toffees with cream/milk in a pan or microwave, then drizzle over the cooled cake.
