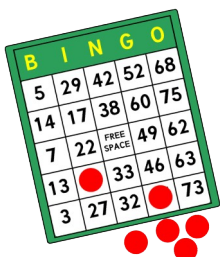

Wind turbine plans



Many villagers are extremely concerned about the wind turbines planned for the top of Woldgate/Burton Agnes Balk, which could be amongst the biggest in England and dominate the skyline.

The developer, Ridge Clean Energy, is submitting a formal planning application for the Three Oaks Renewable Energy Park Extension early in 2026. If approved, the construction and operation of the turbines could have a significant impact on the village and surrounding area. At around 495ft/150m, they would be significantly larger than those at Lissett and Fraisthorpe.

Michelle Foster, a Rudston resident who lives on Eastgate, is trying to raise awareness of the issue so that people are fully equipped with the information needed to arrive at an informed view.

She says that the developer is strategically misrepresenting the impact on the area. "Information shared so far is biased towards a positive outcome for the company. An example is that the photos displayed at their exhibition and on their website do not represent the beauty of our countryside."

The main concerns raised

Damage to tourism

This is one of the major issues. "The inland coastal area of the East Riding has very few tourist attractions, and the development will directly affect three connected destinations – Burton Agnes Hall, Woldgate and the Rudston Monolith" says Michelle. Interestingly, images of Woldgate by world-famous artist David Hockney sold for £6.2m at auction in October.

"Tourism is essential to our economy, providing jobs and income for people in our area" said Michelle. "This development would not create any meaningful number of new jobs".

Health and wellbeing of people and nature

A number of national and international studies have explored the impact on health in people living close to wind turbines, with noise often highlighted as being hugely damaging. "The peace and tranquillity is likely to be ruined by the turbines during construction and operation, and could have a catastrophic effect on people and wildlife" she said.

House price drops

At the exhibition, the developer quoted a study by RenewableUK that found no link between wind turbines and deflated house prices. Michelle responded "It was in the developer's interest to quote this research when other studies point to a big hit on house prices, of up to 15%, along with fewer people willing to view properties near to turbines".

Opening the floodgates

There are widespread concerns that once a strong National Grid connection has been established, developers will not stop at the existing proposals, as it would make financial sense to install more solar and wind developments in the immediate area. Michelle said "We should ask 'are these plans proportionate, and where will it stop?'".

To conclude

Michelle and other villagers believe that East Riding of Yorkshire Council, along with all local stakeholders, has a duty to protect nature and the special landscape of the area.

"While we need more clean energy production, we must also consider whether this should be at the expense of local nature, biodiversity, our rolling rural landscape and cultural attractions. We need to strike a balance" she said.

What next?

If you want to object to the plans, keep an eye out for the planning submission by visiting the planning section of East Riding of Yorkshire Council's website, where the application will be published along with instructions on how to officially lodge your objection.

WINTER GARDENING JOBS FOR DECEMBER & JANUARY



Ornamental Garden:

- Take hardwood cuttings from shrubs like dogwood and viburnum.
- Prune wisteria by shortening new growth to 2–3 buds

Vegetables & Fruit:

- Harvest parsnips, kale and sprouts – flavour improves after frost.
- Plan next year's crop rotation and order seeds.

Maintenance:

- Clean and sharpen tools.
- Check for wind damage on fences and supports.

Wildlife Tip:

Keep ponds ice-free with a floating ball or by placing hot water on the surface (don't smash ice).

Wildlife Tips for December & January



1. Keep feeders stocked and clean

Winter is the toughest time for garden birds. Provide mixed seed, suet blocks, fat balls and fresh water (unfrozen). Clean feeders regularly to prevent disease.

2. Top up water daily

A shallow bowl of fresh, unfrozen water is as important as food in freezing weather. Break any ice each morning.

3. Spot winter visitors

Look for redwings, fieldfares and bramblings in berry-laden hedgerows. On the coast, you might see purple sandpipers and turnstones.

4. Leave seedheads and berries

Teasels, thistles and ivy berries help sustain wildlife until spring. Avoid heavy pruning of berry bushes until late winter.

5. Offer shelter

Log piles, dense shrubs and even old plant pots on their sides can give cover to wrens, robins and small mammals in harsh weather.

6. Check compost and log piles before moving

Hibernating frogs, newts and hedgehogs may be tucked away inside.

7. Listen for birdsong in January

By late January, robins, song thrushes and great tits start singing to claim territories - a hint that spring is on its way.

8. Watch for early snowdrops (*January highlight*)

They're not wildlife in the strictest sense, but they provide an early nectar source for any brave bees venturing out.



Rudston's Recipes

BRIE, CRANBERRY & CHESTNUT PUFF PASTRY WREATH

Ingredients (Serves 6-8 as a starter)

- 1 sheet of ready-rolled puff pastry
- 150g Brie, sliced
- 3 tbsp cranberry sauce
- 100g cooked chestnuts, roughly chopped
- 1 egg, beaten (for glazing)
- Fresh rosemary (optional, for garnish)
- Flour (for dusting)

Method

- Preheat oven to 200°C / 180°C fan / Gas mark 6.
- Line a baking sheet.
- Unroll puff pastry and cut into a large circle (use a plate as a guide).
- Mark a smaller circle inside, like a ring or wreath. Score gently, don't cut through.
- Within the outer ring, arrange Brie, chestnuts and spoonfuls of cranberry sauce evenly.
- Cut the inner ring into slices like the spokes of a wheel and twist them over the filling to make a wreath shape.
- Brush with beaten egg and bake for 20-25 minutes until golden and puffed.
- Garnish with rosemary sprigs if desired and serve warm.

Rudston's Recipes (continued)

SPICED CLEMENTINE & ALMOND MINCE PIE TART

Ingredients (Serves 8)

200g plain flour
100g cold butter, cubed
25g ground almonds
2 tbsp icing sugar
1 egg yolk
1-2 tbsp cold water

For the filling:

1 jar (400g) good-quality mincemeat
Zest of 2 clementines
1 tbsp brandy or orange juice
1 tsp ground cinnamon
Flaked almonds, for topping
Icing sugar, to dust

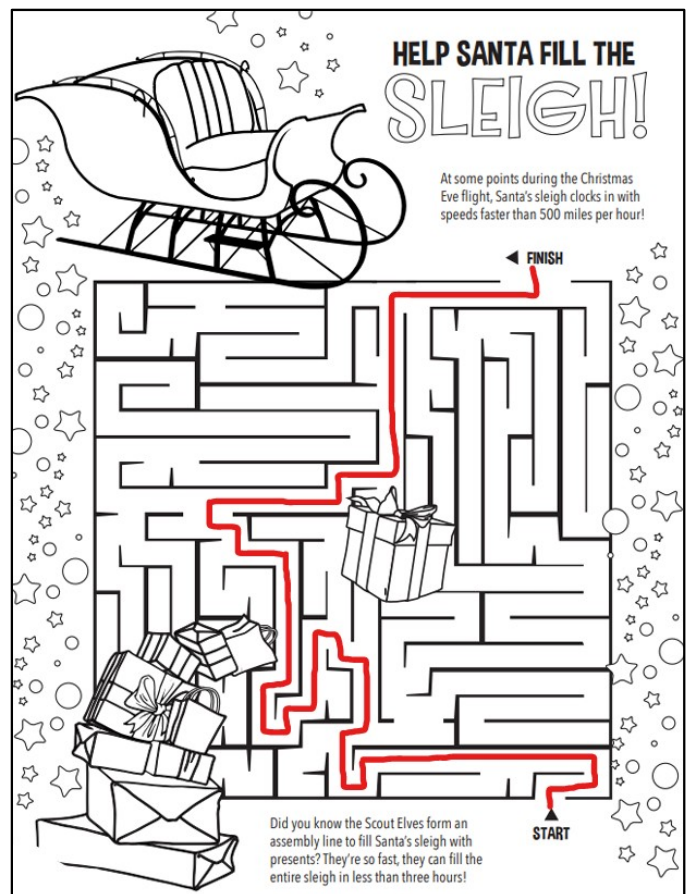
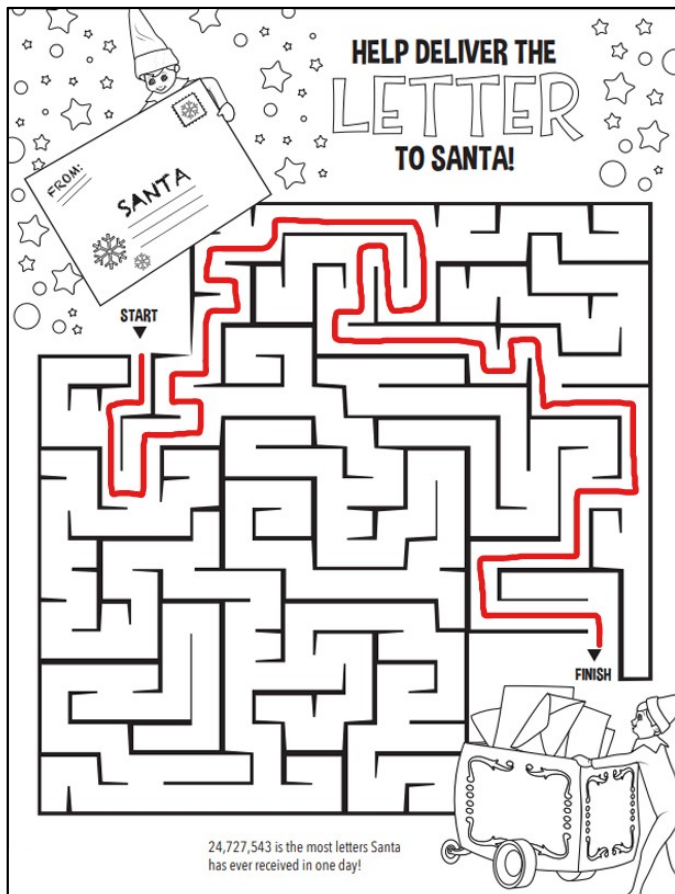
Method

- Make pastry: rub flour and butter together to form breadcrumbs.
- Stir in almonds and icing sugar. Add egg yolk and enough water to bring together into a dough.
- Chill 20 mins.
- Preheat oven to 180°C / 160°C fan / Gas mark 4.
- Mix mincemeat with clementine zest, brandy/orange juice and cinnamon.
- Roll out pastry and press into a tart tin. Spoon in the mincemeat mixture.
- Sprinkle with flaked almonds and bake for 25-30 minutes until golden.
- Cool, dust with icing sugar and serve with cream or brandy butter.
