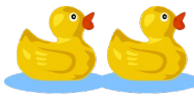

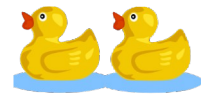

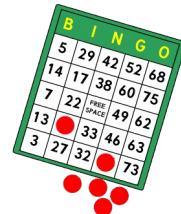
Rudston Duck Race Easter Monday 6th April

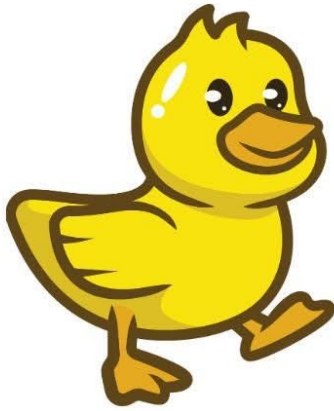
Rachel Wilkinson, Carnaby Church

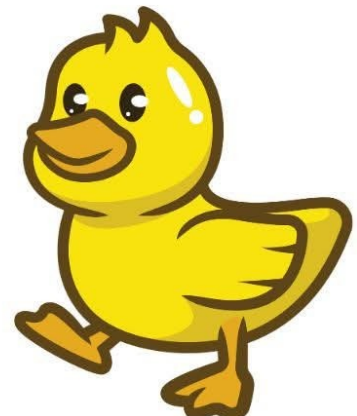

VILLAGE UNDER THREAT:
Locals fight 'shocking' wind farm proposal



“If you are worried about the proposed wind farm that will dominate our village, please talk about it and tell everyone you see”. That's the message from Rudston resident Michelle Foster, who has lived in the village all her life and is a member of the newly formed campaign group, Keep Wind Off Woldgate.

Michelle says she is concerned that many people in the area are still unaware of the proposed development, or of its scale and potential impact.

Impact of plans on our area

The developer, Oxfordshire-based Ridge Clean Energy, is preparing plans for a major wind turbine project on land bordered by Woldgate and Burton Agnes Balk.

The proposed Three Oaks Renewable Energy Park Extension would see turbines reaching heights comparable to the Humber Bridge. The development would directly

affect Rudston, Burton Agnes and Carnaby, with some homes located within just one kilometre of the site. Due to the elevated landscape, the turbines would also be visible across the wider Yorkshire Wolds and coastline for many miles around.

“Turbines in this location would be shocking”, says Michelle.

“Not only would they be significantly larger than those at Lissett and Carnaby, but their height would be exaggerated by the elevated ground, which rises to around 60 metres above sea level.

“Some of the most beautiful and peaceful views in the area would be industrialised. There would be noise, lights at night, and a loss of tranquillity and of dark skies. The land would be filled with concrete and changed forever, and wildlife would suffer”.

Ridge Clean Energy is expected to submit a formal planning application to East Riding of Yorkshire Council in late March or April. At that stage, residents will be able to formally submit objections.

‘Gold rush’ for developers

Michelle believes the proposal reflects a wider trend. *“I don’t believe these developers are green energy activists; they are businesspeople jumping on a commercial opportunity,” she says.*

“The government is pushing for net zero and has reopened the door to onshore wind, but without a clear strategy. That leaves communities like ours vulnerable to developers with no connection to the area and no real appreciation of what makes it special.

“If they truly cared, they wouldn’t be planning an industrial development on Woldgate”.

Campaign group calls for community action

The Keep Wind Off Woldgate campaign group has been formed to raise awareness and encourage local involvement.

The group stresses it is not opposed to onshore wind in principle, but believes developments should be located in less sensitive areas.

Residents are encouraged to stay informed and get involved through the campaign’s website and Facebook page, where updates will be shared, including details of the planning application and public meetings at the village hall.

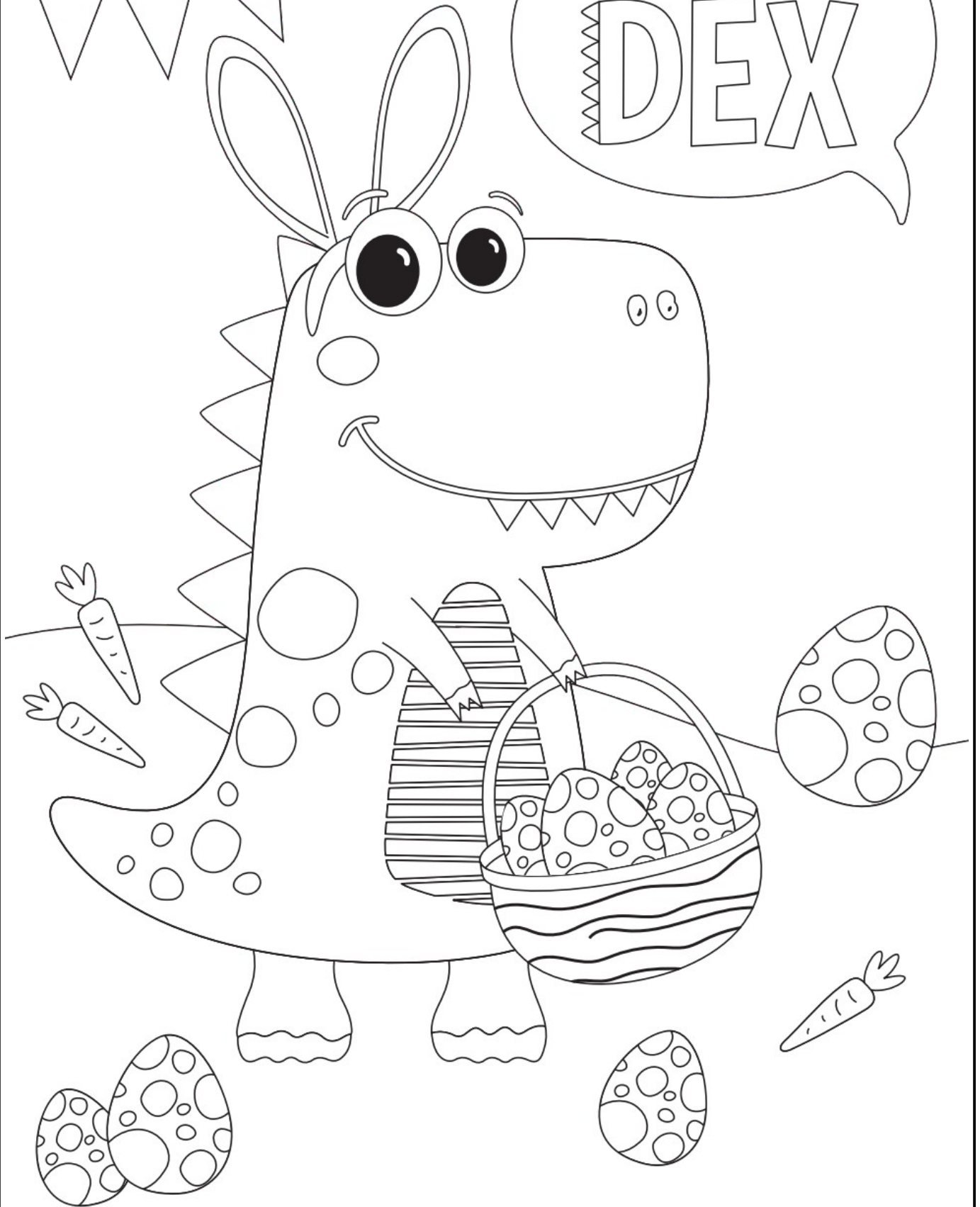
Work has started getting the field ready for cricket and general enjoyment. It's a big job and volunteers put in a huge amount of work for which we are all grateful.

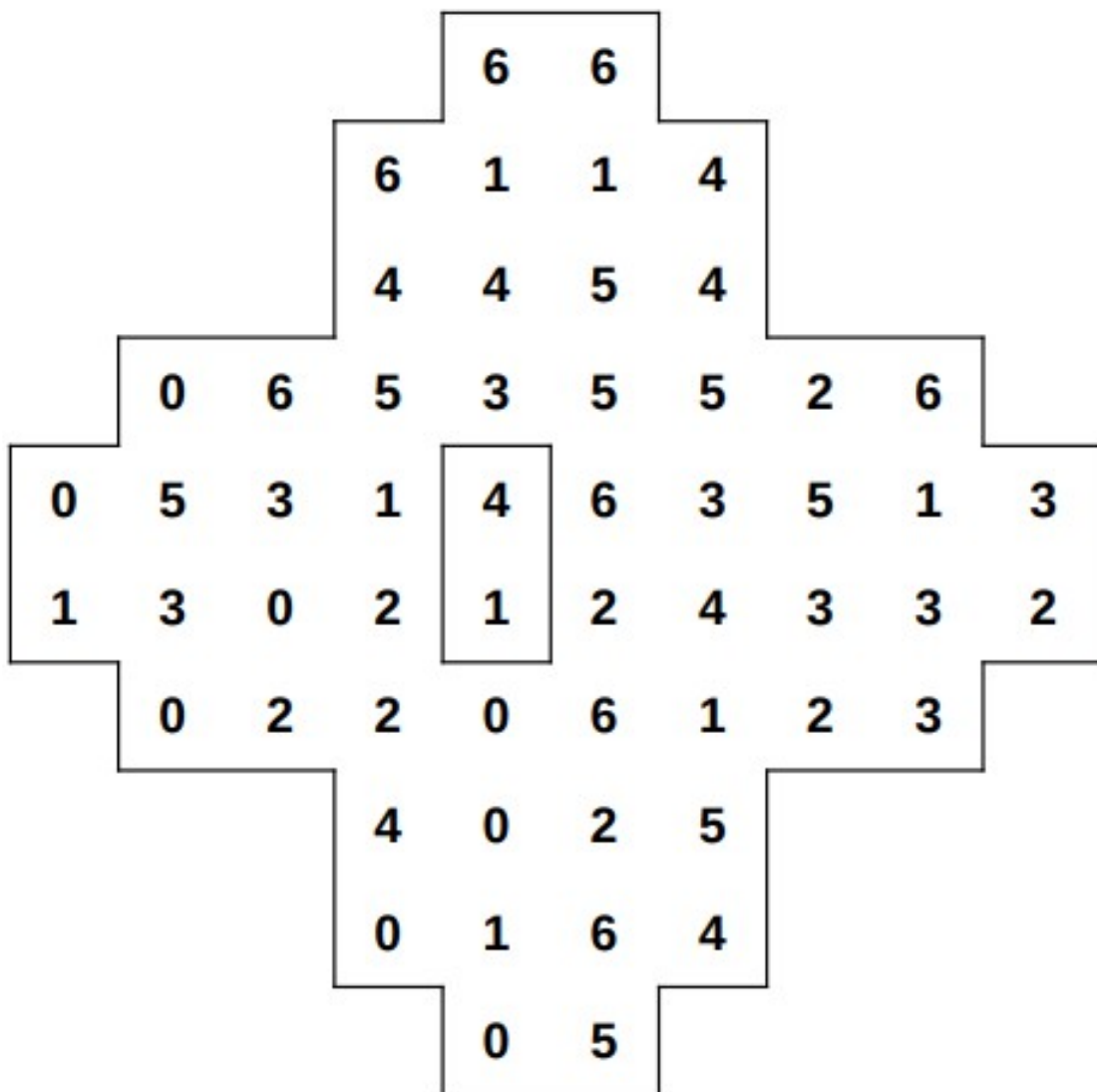

❄️ GARDENING JOBS FOR APRIL ❄️



Ornamental Garden:

- Tie in shoots of climbing roses and clematis.
- Plant summer bulbs (e.g. lilies, gladioli).
- Protect young plants from slugs and snails.



Vegetables & Fruit:

- Sow peas, courgettes, pumpkins, French beans under cover.
- Plant out onion sets and first early potatoes.



Maintenance:

- Install water butts if not already done.
- Set up plant supports before things get tall and floppy

Wildlife Tips for April

Nesting in Full Swing

April is a busy time for birds.

- Avoid trimming hedges and shrubs where possible.
- Keep feeders topped up and put out fresh water daily.
- Watch from a distance - repeated disturbance can cause nests to fail.



Early Pollinators Need Help

Warmer days bring out bees and butterflies.

- Spring flowers such as bluebell, primrose, forget-me-not and aubretia are important.
- Let lawns grow a little – dandelions are a vital nectar source.
- Avoid using pesticides and weedkillers.

Hedgehogs Fully Awake

Hedgehogs are active and feeding.

- Leave out shallow water bowls, especially during dry spells.
- Check before strimming long grass or clearing piles of leaves.
- Keep gardens linked with small gaps in fences.

Ponds Bursting with Life

April is peak time for pond wildlife.

- Frogspawn and tadpoles should be left undisturbed.
- Add pond plants rather than fish if you want to help wildlife.
- Provide easy access in and out for animals.

Go Gently in the Garden

- Delay major clear-ups – insects and amphibians are sheltering in long grass and borders.
- Compost garden waste instead of burning it.



Enjoy the Signs of Spring

- Swallows returning towards the end of the month
- Bluebells at their best
- Butterflies such as peacock and orange-tip on sunny days



Rudston's Recipes

SPRING VEGETABLE & HERB GALETTE

Ingredients (Serves 4-6)

- 1 sheet of ready-rolled shortcrust or puff pastry
- 100g soft goat's cheese or ricotta
- 1 egg (for glaze)
- 6-8 asparagus spears, trimmed
- 100g frozen peas (defrosted)
- 2 spring onions, thinly sliced
- A few fresh mint and parsley leaves
- Zest of ½ lemon
- Salt & pepper
- Olive oil

Method

- Preheat oven to 200°C / 180°C fan / Gas mark 6. Line a baking tray.
- Unroll the pastry onto the tray. Score a 2cm border around the edge (don't cut through).
- In a bowl, mix goat's cheese with lemon zest, salt, pepper and a little chopped mint. Spread inside the border.
- Arrange asparagus, peas and spring onions over the cheese. Drizzle with olive oil.
- Brush pastry edge with beaten egg and bake for 25-30 minutes until golden.
- Scatter with fresh herbs and serve warm or at room temperature.

Rudston's Recipes (continued)

MINI EGG CHOCOLATE NEST CAKES

Ingredients (makes 12)

200g milk chocolate (or a mix of milk & dark)	36 mini chocolate eggs
75g shredded wheat, cornflakes, or rice crispies	Paper bun cases
2 tbsp golden syrup (optional for extra stickiness)	

Method

- Melt chocolate gently in a bowl over a pan of simmering water (or in the microwave).
- Stir in golden syrup if using, then crumble in the shredded wheat (or chosen cereal).
- Spoon the mixture into paper bun cases in a muffin tin, pressing a dip into the centre of each to form a nest.
- Place 3 mini eggs in each nest and chill in the fridge for at least 1 hour to set.

EASTER BLONDIES

Ingredients (makes 12 portions)

200g butter	1 vanilla pod
200g light brown sugar	1 pinch of salt
200g white chocolate	80g Galaxy Minstrels mini eggs **
4 eggs	100g Milky Bar mini eggs **
180g plain flour	

** Try alternative mini eggs to suit taste

Method

- Pre-heat your oven to 180°C/160°C fan/gas mark 4. Line a rectangular cake tin with grease proof paper.
- Melt the butter in a pan along with the white chocolate and sugar.
- Once melted completely, allow to cool, stirring frequently to ensure it stays smooth and liquid.
- Once the butter and chocolate mixture is cool, whisk in the eggs, one at a time.
- Scrape the seeds out of the vanilla pod and fold through the liquid mix with the salt and flour. Pour the batter into the tin.
- Bake in the centre of the oven for 30 minutes or until a crust has formed on top of the brownies but they are bouncy to the touch.
- 5 minutes before taking out of the oven, push the mini eggs into the top of the brownies - don't be afraid to create cracks in the surface.
- Allow to cool slightly before slicing and serving.
