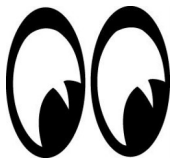

Wind farm proposal update



At the time of writing, Ridge Clean Energy had not yet submitted a formal planning application for the proposed wind farm near Rudston. The Keep Wind Off Woldgate campaign is monitoring the situation closely and will share updates as soon as new information becomes available.

Why campaigners oppose the wind farm

The proposed Three Oaks Renewable Energy Park would include six turbines, each around 150 metres tall - comparable in height to the towers of the Humber Bridge. They would be located on elevated land bordered by Burton Agnes Balk, Woldgate and Rudston Road, with significant visual impact on the villages and the surrounding area.

Campaigners argue that while renewable energy is essential, the location of large-scale developments must be carefully considered. They maintain that this is not opposition to clean energy, but to the siting of an industrial-scale project in a sensitive landscape. Alternative, more suitable locations are available, and once a landscape of this kind is fundamentally changed, the impact is long-lasting.

Gas drilling at Foxholes

A separate campaign group, Drawing a Line in the Chalk, is opposing a proposed gas drilling project at Foxholes. The group is currently seeking volunteers to help distribute information about an upcoming public meeting. Concerns have been raised about potential impacts on local water systems, all the way south to the River Hull. This highlights broader concerns about the area's vulnerability to industrial development and the value of connecting with other local campaigns.

❄️ GARDENING JOBS FOR MAY ❄️

Ornamental Garden:

- **Harden off** indoor-grown bedding plants.
- Plant summer bedding after the last frost (often mid-May).
- Deadhead spring bulbs and feed with potash-based fertiliser.



Vegetables & Fruit:

- Sow sweetcorn, squash, lettuce, and radish.
- Earth up potatoes regularly.
- Protect strawberries with straw and netting.



Lawns:

- Mow weekly and feed with spring fertiliser
- Edge borders for a crisp finish.

Wildlife Tips for May - Peak Nesting Season

May is one of the busiest months for birds.

- Try not to disturb hedges, shrubs or trees where birds may be nesting.
- Keep cats indoors at dawn and dusk if possible – these are peak feeding times for birds.
- Put out fresh water daily, especially in dry spells.



Pollinators Everywhere

Bees, butterflies and other insects are now very active.

- Let part of your lawn grow - dandelions, clover and daisies are valuable nectar sources.
- Avoid pesticides and weedkillers.
- Plant bee-friendly flowers such as **lavender, foxglove, allium and comfrey**.

Hedgehogs on the Move

Hedgehogs are fully active by May.

- Check gardens before strimming or mowing long grass.
- Leave out shallow water bowls during warm weather.
- Create wildlife corridors by leaving small gaps in fences.



Ponds Full of Life

Ponds are bustling this month.

- Tadpoles are growing fast - don't move or feed them.
- Add plants rather than fish if you want to support wildlife.
- Keep some pond edges shallow for birds and mammals to drink safely.

A Gentler Garden Helps Wildlife

- Cut back only what's necessary - "a little wild" is good for nature.
- Leave logs or stones in quiet corners to provide shelter for insects.
- Compost garden waste to support soil life.

Enjoy the Signs of Spring

- Swallows and swifts returning
- Bluebell woods at their best
- Young birds fledging (often spotted hopping on the ground – parents are usually nearby)





Rudston's Recipes

ASPARAGUS, NEW POTATO & FETA SALAD WITH HERBY DRESSING

Ingredients (Serves 4)

- 400g new potatoes, halved
- 1 bunch British asparagus, trimmed
- 100g feta cheese, crumbled
- A handful of baby spinach or rocket (optional)

For the dressing:

- 3 tbsp olive oil
- 1 tbsp lemon juice
- 1 tsp Dijon mustard
- 1 small garlic clove, crushed
- 1 tbsp fresh parsley, chopped
- 1 tbsp fresh mint, chopped
- Salt & pepper to taste

Method

- Boil new potatoes until just tender (about 12-15 mins). Drain and let cool slightly.
- Steam or boil asparagus for 2-3 mins until bright green and just tender. Cool quickly in cold water to keep colour.
- Whisk dressing ingredients together in a small bowl.
- Toss potatoes, asparagus, feta and salad leaves (if using) in a bowl. Drizzle with dressing and serve warm or chilled.

Rudston's Recipes (continued)

STRAWBERRY & ELDERFLOWER SHORTCAKES

Ingredients (serves 6)

For the shortcakes:

225g self-raising flour
50g caster sugar
75g cold butter, cubed
1 egg
3 tbsp milk

For the filling:

300g fresh strawberries, halved or sliced
1 tbsp elderflower cordial
150ml double cream
1 tbsp icing sugar
A few mint leaves (optional)

Method

- Preheat oven to 200°C / 180°C fan / Gas Mark 6. Line a baking tray.
- Rub butter into flour until it resembles breadcrumbs. Stir in sugar.
- Beat egg with milk and mix in to form a soft dough. Gently knead and roll out to 2cm thickness. Cut out 6 rounds.
- Place on tray and bake for 12-15 minutes until golden. Cool on a wire rack.
- Mix strawberries with elderflower cordial and let sit for 10 minutes.
- Whip cream with icing sugar to soft peaks.
- Slice shortcakes in half, fill with cream and strawberries, and top with mint if using.
