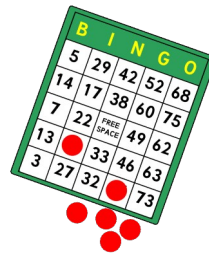

ALERT: Wind farm planning application now submitted



Ridge Clean Energy has now submitted its planning application for the Three Oaks Renewable Energy Park Extension comprising an industrial-scale wind farm on land bordering Woldgate and Rudston Road.

At the time of writing this article, East Riding of Yorkshire Council was still in the process of validating the application. Once that is completed, it will be uploaded to the public access website with a deadline for comments.

Hundreds of acres

If the wind farm goes ahead, it will join onto an already consented solar farm and create a renewable energy park stretching all the way from Haisthorpe to Woldgate covering hundreds of acres.

Public Meetings

Campaigners from the affected villages have planned a public meeting at Rudston Village Hall on June 30th to share concerns and guidance on how to object. It is vital that people make an official objection to the plans, so the campaign group will hold an additional meeting before the deadline. Leaflets will be delivered through doors over the next few weeks with more details and date for the meeting.

David Hockney

This wind farm would have a hugely negative impact on nature, tourism, local people's wellbeing and the beautiful landscape - including Woldgate, made globally famous through the art of David Hockney who sadly died in June. Hockney spoke out in 2012 against similar plans for the same location which were ultimately refused by East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

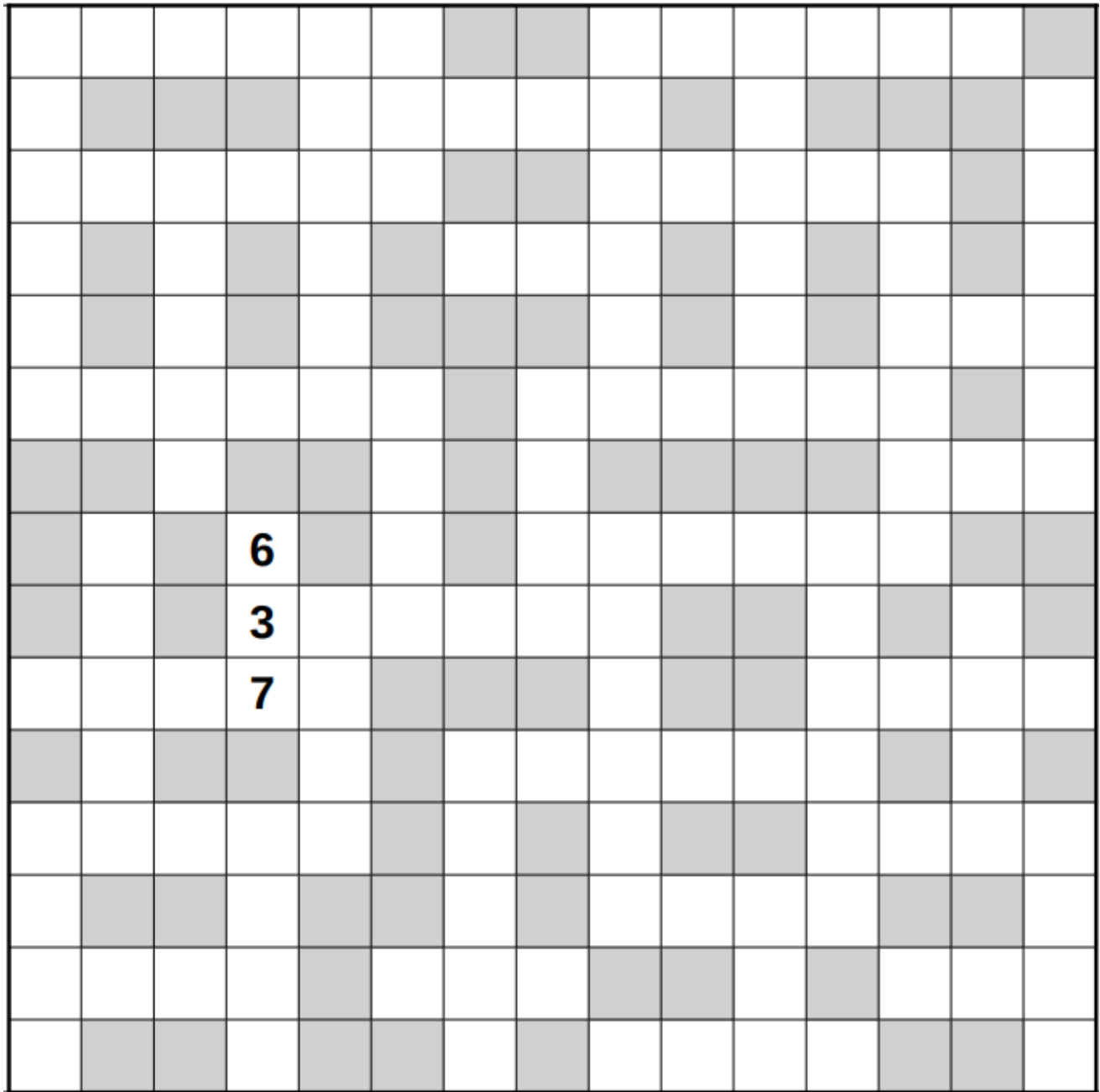

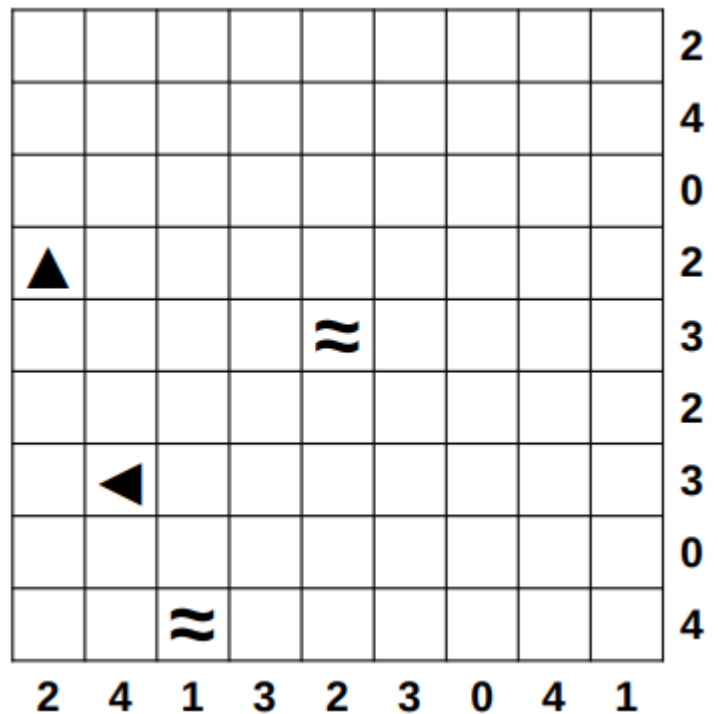

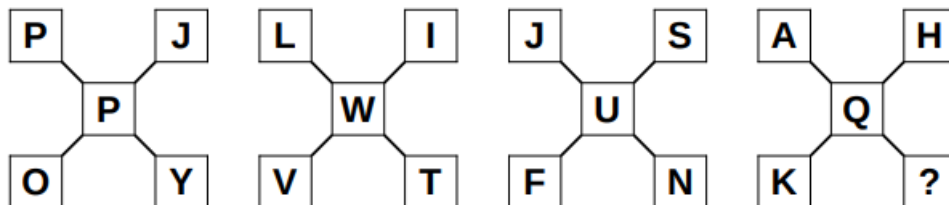

SUMMER GARDENING JOBS FOR JULY & AUGUST



Ornamental Garden:

- Deadhead bedding plants and perennials regularly to prolong flowering.
- Cut back faded perennials such as delphiniums and lupins to encourage a second flush.
- Take semi-ripe cuttings from shrubs like lavender, rosemary and salvias.
- Collect and store seeds from self-seeding annuals like poppies, nigella and cosmos.



Vegetables & Fruit:

- Continue to harvest crops such as tomatoes, courgettes, berries and beans to keep plants productive.
- Pinch outside shoots on tomatoes and squash to concentrate energy on ripening fruit.
- Sow autumn and winter vegetables like kale, pak choi, turnips and spinach for later harvests.



Lawns & Maintenance:

- Water early in the morning or late evening to minimise evaporation.
- Mulch beds and containers to retain moisture and suppress weeds.
- Trim and edge lawns regularly, but avoid cutting during drought stress.

Planning Ahead:

- Order spring-flowering bulbs (e.g. daffodils, crocuses, alliums).
- Plan autumn planting and think about where to add new shrubs or perennials.



Wildlife Tip:

- Provide shallow water dishes for bees, birds and hedgehogs during hot spells.
- Avoid hedge cutting until late August to protect nesting birds.

Wildlife Tips for July & August

Help Wildlife in Hot Weather

Summer heat and dry spells can be hard on wildlife.

- Put out **shallow bowls of water** for birds, hedgehogs and insects; refresh them daily.
- Add a few stones or marbles so insects can drink safely.
- Leave some shaded areas in the garden.



Late-Summer Food for Insects

Pollinators are still active and need fuel.

- Let herbs like lavender, thyme and mint flower.
- Leave some thistles, knapweed and brambles - they're rich nectar sources.
- Avoid pesticides and "quick-fix" treatments.

Hedgehogs Raising Young

Late summer is a crucial time for hedgehogs.

- Check before mowing, strimming or lighting bonfires.
- Keep gardens connected - a small gap in fences can save a long journey.
- Water is more important than food in hot weather.

Butterflies & Moths at Their Best

July and August are peak months.

- Look out for gatekeeper, comma, red admiral and painted lady butterflies.
- Night-flying moths are important pollinators - consider leaving outdoor lights off where possible.



Let Nature Go to Seed

- Leave seed heads on flowers and grasses - they'll feed birds later in the year.
- Avoid cutting back hedges until autumn.
- Create a "wild corner" and see what appears.

Enjoy Summer Wildlife:

- Swallows feeding young and gathering on wires
- Bats hunting at dusk
- Dragonflies and damselflies around ponds and ditches





Rudston's Recipes

SUMMER VEGETABLE GALETTE

Ingredients

- 1 sheet of ready-rolled shortcrust pastry (or make your own)
- 1 medium courgette, thinly sliced
- 150g cherry tomatoes, halved
- 1 small red onion, finely sliced
- 1 small red or yellow pepper, sliced
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 100g goat's cheese or feta, crumbled
- 1 tsp dried oregano or fresh thyme
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 egg, beaten (for glazing)

Method

- Preheat the oven to 200°C / 180°C fan / Gas mark 6.
- Toss the courgette, tomatoes, onion and pepper in olive oil, salt, pepper and herbs.
- Roll out the pastry onto a lined baking tray. Arrange the vegetables in the centre, leaving a 4-5cm border.
- Sprinkle cheese over the top of the vegetables.
- Fold the edges of the pastry over the filling, pleating slightly. Brush the pastry with the beaten egg.
- Bake for 30-35 minutes until golden and crisp.
- Cool slightly before slicing. Serve warm or cold at your picnic.

Rudston's Recipes (continued)

STRAWBERRY & ELDERFLOWER BLONDIES

Ingredients

125g unsalted butter, melted	2 tbsp elderflower cordial
200g light brown sugar	150g plain flour
1 egg	½ tsp baking powder
1 tsp vanilla extract	100g fresh strawberries, chopped

Optional: white chocolate chips or flaked almonds for topping

Method

- Preheat oven to 180°C / 160°C fan / Gas mark 4. Grease and line a 20cm square tin.
- In a bowl, mix melted butter and sugar. Stir in the egg, vanilla and elderflower cordial.
- Fold in flour and baking powder, then gently mix in the chopped strawberries.
- Pour into the tin and level the top. Sprinkle with white chocolate or almonds if using.
- Bake for 25-30 minutes until golden and set (a slight wobble in the centre is fine).
- Cool completely before slicing into squares. Transport in a tin lined with baking paper.

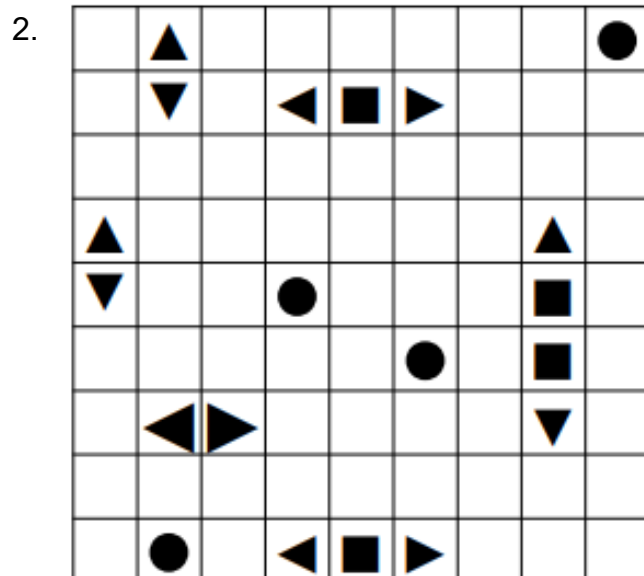
