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Heritage Open Days 2026 - Places to Visit Near Rudston

There are plenty of FREE Heritage Open Days events taking place across the East Riding and Yorkshire Coast between 11th and 20th September. Here are just a few ideas for a fascinating day out close to home:

Beverley

Explore one of Yorkshire's most historic market towns with opportunities to visit buildings that are rarely open to the public. Guided walks, historic homes, churches and behind-the-scenes tours are all part of the programme such as Beverley Masonic Hall, Beverley Minster Secret & Quiet Gardens, Norwood House, St Marys Bell Tower & Priest's room, Beverley Friary plus many more.

Bridlington

Discover the town's rich maritime heritage with free events including historic buildings, churches, guided walks and heritage attractions celebrating Bridlington's fishing, harbour and seaside history such as Bridlington Harbour Heritage Museum, the Chalk Tower (old lighthouse) Flamborough Head, the High Street's Backside (private gardens and yards), The Bayle Museum and Hebblethwaite House just to start with.

Hull

Take advantage of free walks, talks, tours and open days across the city, exploring everything from museums and historic buildings to Hull's maritime past. Holderness House (the former home of Thomas Feren's, Hull's greatest philanthropist), The Charterhouse and Maister House (one of Hull's oldest and grandest merchant houses, currently undergoing a major renovation) are but a few to see plus a talk on Building the Humber Bridge.

East Riding Villages

Many smaller villages across the East Riding also take part, opening beautiful parish churches, village halls and historic buildings, with local volunteers sharing stories about their communities and traditions - see link below for more information

Plan Your Visit

Some events are "turn up and enjoy", while others require advance booking due to limited numbers, so it's worth checking the details before you travel. The full programme is updated regularly online.

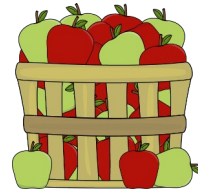
SEPTEMBER WILDLIFE & GARDENING TIPS

September is a lovely month in the garden, with the first hints of autumn appearing but plenty of colour and wildlife still to enjoy. It's also a busy time for gardeners as we prepare our outdoor spaces for the months ahead.

In the garden

- **Collect seeds** from your favourite plants to sow next year, remembering to leave some seed heads for the birds.
- **Plant spring bulbs** such as daffodils, crocuses and alliums while the soil is still warm.
- **Keep deadheading** summer flowers to encourage them to bloom for as long as possible.
- **Start dividing** overcrowded herbaceous perennials and move plants that need a new home.
- **Make the most of fallen leaves** by collecting them to create leaf mould – an excellent natural soil improver.

Harvest apples, pears and other fruit as they ripen, and share any surplus with friends, neighbours or local wildlife.



Helping our wildlife



- Leave a small area of your garden a little untidy. Long grass, piles of leaves and fallen branches provide valuable shelter for insects, frogs and hedgehogs.
- **Keep bird feeders topped up** and provide fresh water, as natural food sources can become scarcer as autumn approaches.
- **Check bonfires carefully before lighting them.** Hedgehogs and other small creatures may crawl into piles of garden waste for shelter.
- If you have a pond, avoid clearing away all the vegetation - it provides important cover for amphibians and insects.
- Look out for **spiders, butterflies and bees** enjoying the last of the late-summer flowers. Ivy coming into flower is particularly valuable to bees and other pollinators at this time of year.

 A little thought now can make a big difference later. By leaving some seed heads, fallen leaves and natural areas in our gardens, we can provide food and shelter for wildlife throughout the autumn and winter - while creating a garden that will burst back into life next spring.



Rudston's Recipes

A great way to use up a glut of home-grown courgettes and they're ideal for lunch boxes, picnics or a light lunch. The recipe, takes around 35 minutes and makes 9 muffins.

EASY COURGETTE & FETA MUFFINS

Ingredients

200g self-raising flour
1 tsp baking powder
½ tsp bicarbonate of soda
½ tsp cumin seeds
1 egg
150ml buttermilk
5 tbsp sunflower oil
1 small courgette, grated and squeezed dry
100g feta cheese, crumbled

Method

- Heat the oven to 200°C/180°C fan/Gas 6 and line a muffin tin with 9 cases.
- Mix the flour, baking powder, bicarbonate of soda and cumin in a bowl.
- In a jug, whisk together the egg, buttermilk and oil.
- Pour the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients. Add the grated courgette and half the feta.
- Stir gently until just combined.
- Spoon into the muffin cases and sprinkle with the remaining feta.
- Put them in the oven for 18-20 minutes, until golden.

Rudston's Recipes (continued)

LITTLE CHEF APPLE & BLACKBERRY CRUMBLE

This is a particularly good recipe for a young child to help make. This child-friendly version from Good Food is specifically designed for children aged 5-9 to get involved with, plus you may be able to pick the blackberries locally.

Little helpers can: measure the ingredients, mix the fruit, rub the butter into the flour and sprinkle the crumble over the top

Ingredients

8 eating apples
1 tsp cinnamon
3 tbsp sugar
½ orange
1 punnet of raspberries or blackberries
75g cold butter
50g plain flour
50g oats

Method

- Ask a grown-up to heat the oven to 200°C/180°C fan/Gas 6.
- With adult help, peel, core and chop the apples.
- Put the apples in a bowl with the cinnamon, 1 tbsp sugar and the juice of half an orange.
- Add the blackberries and gently mix everything together.
- Tip the fruit into a baking dish.
- Rub the butter into the flour using your fingertips until it resembles breadcrumbs.
- Stir in the oats and remaining sugar.
- Sprinkle the crumble mixture over the fruit and dot with the remaining butter.
- Ask a grown-up to bake for around 40 minutes, until golden and the fruit is soft.
- Serve with warm custard, cream or vanilla ice cream.
