Dear Friends,

Things are changing. This month churches have been able to open for individual private prayer and just this week we had the government's announcement that from July 4<sup>th</sup> churches may open for public worship.

It has been a strange few months and as the Bishop of London reminded us the first time in over 800 years the country has been without public worship and sacraments.

We are still waiting for the detailed guidance on what we will need to do to open safely and arrangements for weddings, funerals and baptisms. We do know it will not be an immediate return to normality. Our bishops have advised us that, 'Government guidance is permissive not prescriptive. Churches that are not fully ready by July 4th should not feel any obligation to rush to restart public worship'

So keep your eye on the church notice board for what's happening. I'll also keep folk updated via the village Facebook page.

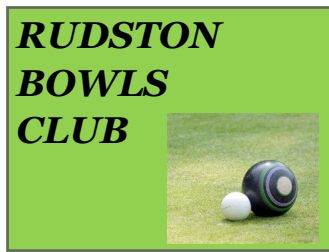
### **PLAYING FIELDS**

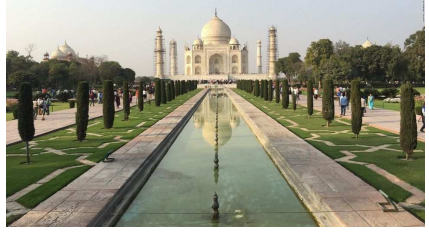

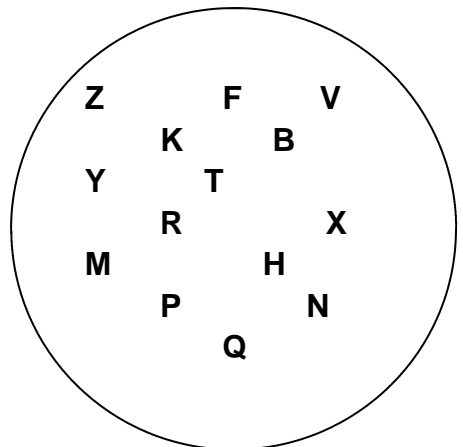
