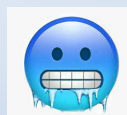
We hope it won't be too long now until we can have services in Church.

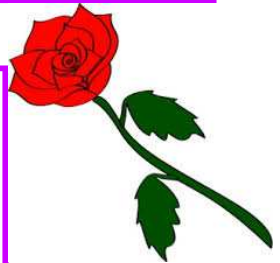

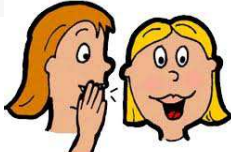


