Following communication between the owner and the Pub steering group, the owner has confirmed that the pub is available for purchase and has given us an asking price which is in-line with our expectation.

The steering group are in the process of setting up a Community Benefit Society which will be a community owned company capable of raising the required funds with help from the Plunkett Foundations "More than a Pub" programme, this will include a Community Share issue. An independent viability study has been completed and a draft business plan produced.

This is a real opportunity for the Community to take ownership of the Bosville Arms and see it re-opened as the village pub it has the potential to be.

Once the Community Benefit Society is set up, which should take a couple of weeks, we plan to hold a public meeting to update everyone and discuss how you can support these efforts in a variety of ways including practical help with a refurbishment of the pub if we are successful with the purchase.

The next meeting of Rudston W I will be held in Rudston Village hall on Tuesday 5 th November at 7 p.m. when John Walker will show slides and tell us about his visit to Alpine Switzerland. Hostesses are Betty Wells and Shirley Sutton and Gloria Traves is due to give the vote of thanks. The competition is a travel memento.

After the meeting the first committee meeting took place. Envy is a very ugly emotion, blowing out someone else's candle doesn't make yours shine brighter.

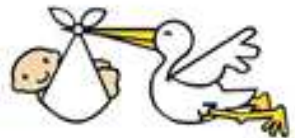

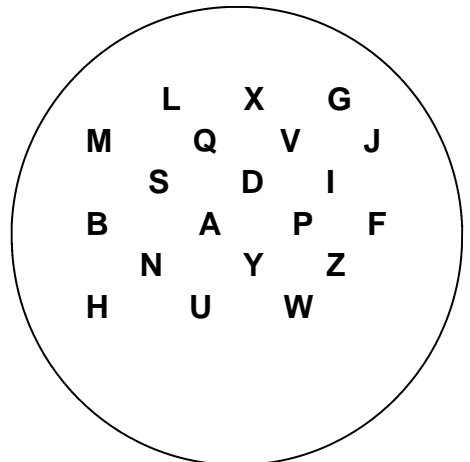
