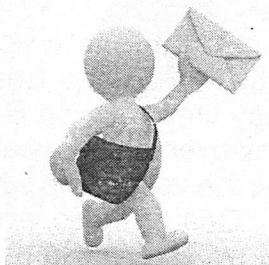
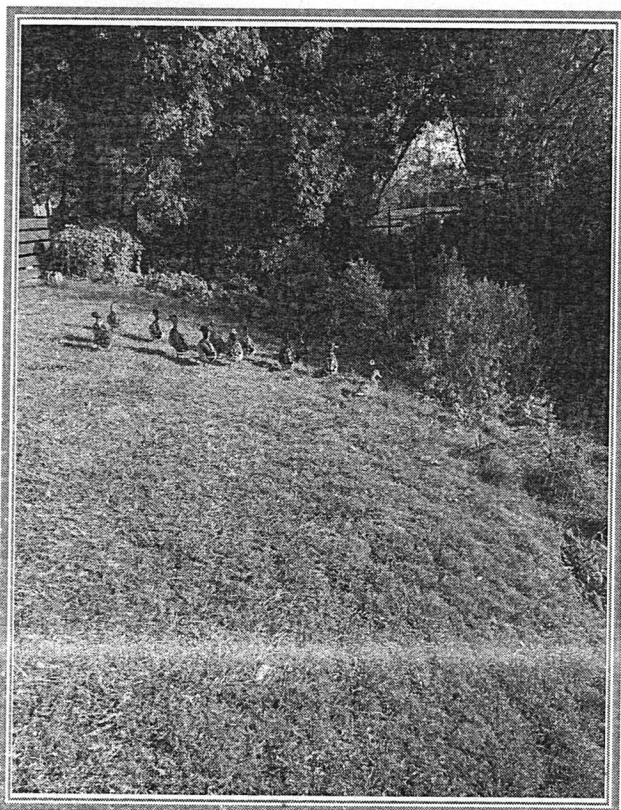

The store will be run as previously, through the cash honesty box, with progressive improvements to include more high tech facilities such as a card reader.



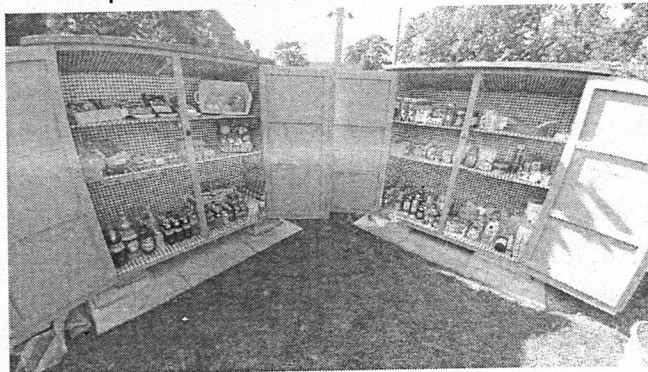
A new lighting system and security cameras have been installed and the area will be landscaped over time.

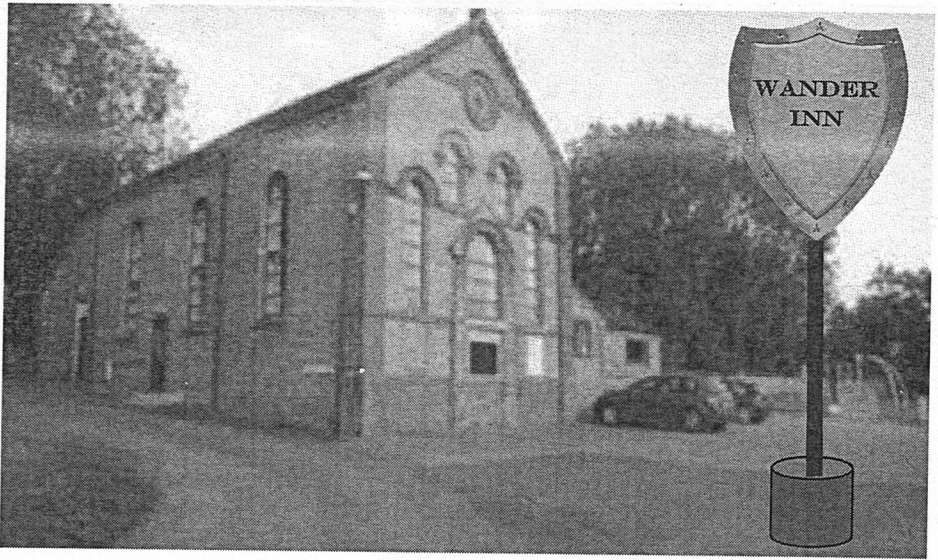

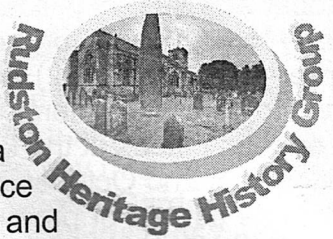


for a grant to help pay for repainting the near hard court which was completed at the end of August. Just a reminder that tennis trainers must be worn on the court and no black soled trainers.

The first meeting of the Autumn season of the Rudston Heritage History group took place on Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> September, when Rick Hudson gave a presentation on The Bridlington Peace Pageant of 1919. illustrated with photos and ciné film from the time.



The end of the First World War was celebrated in July 1919 by a week of events in Bridlington. The main organiser of the pageant was Mr Robert Horspool, the art master at Bridlington Grammar School.

The week started with the presentation of a tank to the town. The tank was driven through Bridlington to the Priory.

On the Wednesday and Thursday a parade took place through the town along two different routes, with characters in costumes, showing Bridlington's history from early Britons through to the Hanoverians. On both days there was also a re-enactment of a manorial court of about 1760, and a fair on High Green, with displays of old English dances and games.

The final event of the week was a thanksgiving service at the Priory. As we watched the congregation stream out of church it was sad to think that just twenty years later we would be at war again.

The interest in local history which was inspired by the preparations for the Peace Pageant led to the formation in 1920 the Augustinian Society.

The next meeting of the group is on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> October at 7pm in Rudston Village Hall. The speaker is Mr Chris Bonnett. In a change to the previously published programme Mr Bonnett will talk on English and German bunkers of the Second World War. .

Everyone welcome. Admission £2 which includes refreshments.

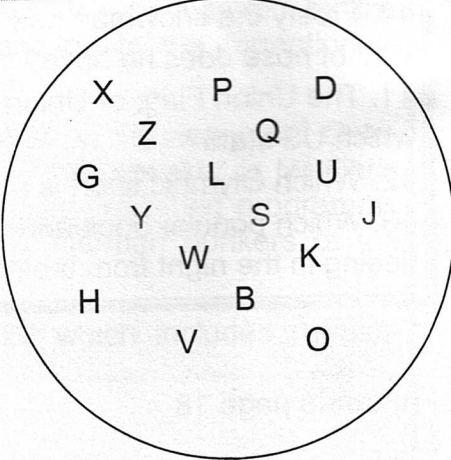

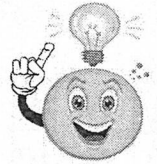
