stating 'no evidence to support the need for a review'.

25/06/2020 - Email to Safer Roads Humber to revisit the situa-
tion and asking what action can be taken.

25/06/2020 - Response from Safer Roads Humber to say cam-
era enforcement suspended due to Covid-19.

25/06/2020 - Email to Highways Department at ERYC to revisit
the situation and asking what action can be taken.

01/07/2020 - Rudston Newsletter article to advise that further
reports made to ERYC and Safer Roads Humber.

17/07/2020 - Response from Highways Department ERYC to
advise Rudston does not meet criteria for traffic calming.

27/08/2020 - Email from Highways Department ERYC to advise
traffic surveys will take place w/c 28/09/2020 on East Gate.

01/09/2020 - Email from Highways Department ERYC to advise
traffic surveys will take place w/c 28/09/2020 on High Street.

I hope this information will prove useful to demonstrate that the
Parish Council is taking the matter seriously and has taken appropri-
ate action.



PUMPKIN PIE RECIPE

1. Preheat oven to 180°C/Gas mark 4.
