I have been asked if I could find the background about the cover photo on last month's newsletter, which was sponsored by Thorpe Hall Estate.

Somerled has furnished us with some fascinating family history.

The Galley is part of the Macdonald of Sleat family crest....the picture I sent was the original wind vane for the top of dove cote; some background....

"Although the story of Clan Donald began long before the immemorial timeline, their history can be traced from the 12th

century BC through a warlord named Somhairle MacGillebride MacGilladamnan (Somerled): head of the ancient Race of Conn and lineal heir of the Dál Riata, the Kingdom of the Scots. Half Viking and half Celtic Irish, Somerled held the unique position as overlord of the Kingdoms of Scotland and Norway which later emerged into the Regulus, or Lordship, of the Isles. Through marriage to the King of Man (Olaf the Red)'s, daughter, cunning and belligerence, Somerled seized the Kingdom of the Isles from his brother-in-law in 1156



and expelled the Norsemen from the Western Isles. A simple rudder was one of the main reasons for Somerled's successful command of Scotland's north-western seaboard. He favoured the Hebridean Galley, a clinker-built vessel based on the Viking longboat, powered by oars and sails. What made this galley different from the longboat was the addition of a stern rudder which rendered the craft fast and manoeuvrable, perfect for raiding and transporting goods and men. These boats were instrumental in the MacDonalds command of the Hebrides until the coming of the mounted gun in the late 16th century" Although we have not been meeting in the traditional way News letters from the Federation have been delivered to each member on a regular basis since our last meeting on 1st March. Those members who felt able and comfortable with safe distancing met at Rudston House for a tour of


We have not been able to meet and have no plans for fund raising at present.

#### **CATTLE PLAGUE**

Can anyone help with a project investigating the cattle plague (rinderpest) of 1865 – 1866?

Hundreds of thousands of cattle were slaughtered and regulations required that they were immediately buried in the field where they had been killed – bur-



ied six feet deep, in the hide and covered with quick-lime.

The project seeks to locate and investigate some of these farm burials. The researchers are using local archives and records and are also keen to find information from local communities. There may be hints in field names, or possibly family stories. The plague had such a devastating effect on farmers that several erected memorial stones to their cattle, and some of these are still known.




